FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

+ May 8, 2022 4th Sunday of Easter

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Beauty: Truth, goodness, and beauty: the philosophers refer to these as the "transcendentals," because their reality is not dependent on epoch or culture or location. Indeed, they fully transcend these conditions. God himself is the ultimate source of truth, goodness, and beauty. He is, we can rightly say, each of these things. St. Augustine famously named God as "Beauty ever ancient, ever new." In fact, many of today's astute observers argue that although our young people may struggle to find God through means of truth (the Culture of Relativism has poisoned that well), they are still discovering God by travelling the path of beauty. In this month of May, beauty is all around us, isn't it? From red and yellow tulips, to trees displaying their spring foliage, to the warmth and brightness of the sun, and to the soaring hawks above, we are blessed with the beauty of spring! Yet as Catholics, we also find great beauty within our churches and liturgies. The joyful faces of our First Holy Communicants are filled with beauty. The light of the Paschal Candle shines with the beauty of Resurrection hope. The smoke of burning incense rises heavenward in beautiful curls and wafts. God gifts the Church with beauty! So as we continue to celebrate these 50-days of the Easter Season, look for the beauty within our Christian Faith. Such God-given beauty is worth spending time to contemplate. And yet more amazingly still, the most wonderful and beautiful things of this earthly life pale in comparison to the beauty promised in the life to come! To some day see God face to face, to share in the heavenly worship, to spend eternity in communion with our loved ones - wow - what beauty then! Thank you, Lord, for the beauty we see around us today, and for the beauty you promise in the life of eternity!

A Worthy Commitment: Not just in the Church, but throughout our society, organizations are struggling to recruit committed volunteers. Families are busy, true. Priorities are, admittedly, sometimes misplaced. And the selfishness with which we all battle can on occasion get the best of us. I say this because we are in desperate need of volunteers to minister in our Faith Formation Programs. Evangelization is the work of us all. Wednesday, May 11th the St. Joseph 4th and 5th grade students will have their Spring Concert in the school gym at 6:30pm.


Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments- Bullying

The Centers for Disease Control and Department of Education define bullying as: any unwanted aggressive behavior(s) by another youth or group of youths, who are not siblings or current dating partners, that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated. 20% of students ages 12-18 experienced bullying nationwide. 19% of students in grades 9-12 report being bullied on school property. When adults respond quickly to bullying behavior, they send the message that it is not acceptable. There are ways parents can make a positive difference. Parents should educate themselves on the signs that a child has been bullied or is a bully. They should keep the lines of communication open with their child and model for their child how to treat others. Parents can encourage their child to be inclusive by welcoming others to join their activities and groups.
