





We want as many of you as possible to participate and we will be having sign ups soon for our own parish listening sessions. These will require attendees to review some of the literature as well. It could feel overwhelming (it did to me!), but let's give it some time and attention and we will all benefit from this process.

Remember, "synod" means walking together – not stuck – and not a race – but accompanying each other on the way to God's Reign in its fullness. Where would we be without Mary and Joseph's walking together?
