





With a new year comes a new approach to "being heard" in the Church. As mentioned in weeks past, the Vatican will be hosting the Synod on Synodality in 2023. To prepare for that, we have our listening sessions coming up later this month and

into February.

Alice Kendziora, Anna Kirk, and Deacon Matthew Ochalek will be facilitating our gatherings of parishioners. (Mike Forish resigned to attend to other matters.) The sessions will be conducted on Wednesdays from 1-3 pm in Pastors' Hall at St John the Baptist and on Thursdays from 6-8 in the gathering space of Holy Rosary Church (near the front doors). The idea was to look at two different times of day and offer what might work for most people. Folks can come to either location, of course.

The Wednesday meetings at St John's will be held January 26, February 9, (and February 23 if needed). The Thursday meetings at Holy Rosary will be held February 3, February 17, (and March 3 if needed). It was felt that at least two meetings would be needed to really let proper feedback emerge.



Our facilitators will attend a training session on Sunday, January 16, at Our Lady of Peace Church – so they will be ready to use the time best. I will join them. They will compose and submit reports to the diocese by the end of March. However, I do not plan to be present so people might speak more openly and freely.

The Diocese will compose a report for the U.S. Bishops' Conference, which must consolidate and synthesize their findings with the Canadian Bishops – so to produce the North American report sent to the Vatican. Those will take the later months of 2022 to compile.

Not all parishes will be hosting listening sessions – which is why we want to have a number of trained facilitators ready should we get calls from folks in those other parishes who wish to participate. Please consider raising your voice – and joining – in this important conversation.

Online Gaming: 72% of teens, both male and female (ages 13-17) play video games. More than half of those teens said they have made new friends online. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children analysis of Cyber Tipline reports has found that gaming platforms are more often used in the online enticement of young boys than any other group of children. It is important for parents to talk to their child about safety in online gaming. Some important questions to ask are: Have you ever been cyberbullied while gaming? Do you know what information is OK to share about yourself while gaming? Has anyone talked about sex while you were gaming or asked you to send pictures of yourself?
