





I've had the blessing of perusing a few good books lately. Have you? Here are a couple:

I've read some of American Catholic author Flannery O'Connor before, but I was not

really prepared to be blown away by the collection of short stories *Everything That Rises Must Converge* (1965) published shortly after her death. You really cannot guess the endings of the stories Greanleaf, View of the Woods, and The Lame Shall Enter First – and you might need to sometime close your mouth after such stunning endings. She weaves faith expressions into each story at some point – so, it's not just entertainment. I also recently read her novel *The Violent Bear It Away* (1960), but that book takes longer to sort out and appreciate. Warning: her writing can be a bit dark.

How was this possible? *Educated:* A Memoir (2018) describes Tara Westover's true upbringing in a dysfunctional and quite abusive Mormon family in the mountains of Idaho. How did she survive? How did she manage to get where she later got? One small step at a time, it turns out. It's a fascinating (if not horrific at times) story. She suffers (literally) at the hands of her brother and father, particularly, and their stubborn rejection of social and national supports (medical and governmental) and schools, in particular). And just when you think some of her family members understand, you realize that some engrained behaviors and attitudes (and traumas) are just insurmountable. Yet she was able to earn a doctorate at Oxford University! Wow – what a message of hope!

An especially engrossing book, *Prayer in the Night* (2021) by Episcopal priest Tish Harrison Warren, captured my attention for more than a week. That's because there's an awful lot to savor. The author situates her reflections upon the Liturgy of the Hours' Night Prayer (Compline) among riveting and emotional stories, including the miscarriage she just experienced in a new and strange city (Pittsburgh). When life turns dark, as it too frequently does, we can find incredible strength in the church's prescribed prayer before sleeping. She concludes by stating that God's love comes at us faster than the speed of light! Hope you find some good inspiration, also!


