



# ALL ARE WELCOME!





Well, maybe it's time to tell you of ANOTHER new development – the way the Diocese is planning to restructure Faith Formation for 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students. We had a preliminary presentation on this back in October, and now

it's getting closer to implementation.

It doesn't make sense to promote a "classroom" approach to students after sixth grade. This is where we've been 'losing them.' No – we need to provide a much more engaging and interactive way to discuss the matters of our faith – and we ought to offer the sacrament of Confirmation at an earlier age than we have been. By the time a student gets to 11<sup>th</sup> grade, we not only compete with employment, but also a great multitude of activities that make the faith seem "irrelevant."

To that end, we are hoping to introduce a process of faith sharing groups that will require a bit more preparation and expertise among our religious educators. We need questioning and wrestling with faith issues to happen more in a less pedagogical environment – in more of a dialogue manner. This will happen – with definite attention to doctrine (we're not abandoning this) but more in active conversation than in a passive way.

Confirmation as an initiation sacrament ought to happen sooner so that our young people have the blessing of the graces and more intentional assistance of the Holy Spirit earlier in life. Some dioceses emphasize that this should be done at First Communion time, but that model has many shortcomings, also – although it restores the natural order of the initiation sacraments (Baptism, Confirmation, and then First Communion). The Church has struggled in the past century or so to "get this right."

If Confirmation happens in 9<sup>th</sup> grade (I received mine in 6<sup>th</sup>), then *mystagogia* (ongoing faith formation following reception) can proceed, especially as we no longer treat Confirmation as "graduation" from youth faith formation. By experiencing the methodology prior to the sacrament, we hope to see this as the way we continue learning about our faith the rest of our lives. This may be difficult to instill in parents, particularly, who experienced the latter themselves.

Stay tuned, as we see what further developments may help this process improve for the future of faith formation – of Church engagement – and of the hoped-for lasting relationship it hopes to foster for each member of the Church with our Lord.
