



Well, that's inconvenient! The heating of Holy Rosary Church was innovative at the time – pipes arranged in a back-andforth pattern in which hot water could flow – encased in concrete – covered with a floor – then the church building erected over it.

PVC had not yet been invented in 1954, so the pipes were metal and the water over 68 years has corroded them so that leaks are springing in several places. Our heating people found some – but not all. Even if we could find the present ones, it seems that other leaks would open – it would just be a matter of time. And remove the pews, floor, and jack hammer all the concrete? That would not be smart.

It appears we must abandon that system and look for a new way to heat the interior of the nave. So, with temporary measures costly and winter weather still a month (or two) ahead – we are grateful we have a partnered parish that has heat. We will have all our Weekend Masses at St John's. Weekday Masses can still be in the warm chapel. Sunday Masses will return to Holy Rosary as the weather (and building) warms naturally. (The space heater just isn't warming the building enough – and is costly).

I asked if we could charge the nave floor pipes with warm water, but with the leaks air bubbles navigate to chapel, sacristy, sanctuary, office, and convectors – the other "zones" in the system – and shut them down until the air is bled out.

Don't forget – St John's had to close for painting in early 2020 (starting Feb 11th). There were, to my count, five weekends that all the St John's Masses had to be hosted at Holy Rosary. Then, public Masses were suspended at all parishes, due to the pandemic (beginning March 18th). We began livestreaming – as best we could – after that. It wasn't until at least June that we began to return to public Masses – at both churches.

Meanwhile, we will have various heating installers bid on a new system. However, we also found out that with this coming summer's stimulus monies already engaging these technicians for all the local schools – it may be hard to get this accomplished on a timely basis. Keep your hands folded and prayers coming.

Lent 2022 - Stations of the Cross
