





There's an awful lot going on these days. There are meetings with the East Erie County parishes to plan for the future (a bulletin insert will soon be coming), Synod listening sessions (which are wrapping up), parish activities, Lent has

begun, Catholic Services Appeal, our Weekend Masses switched due to heating failure, and also the ongoing Pastoral Planning Process conducted by the Diocese. We had a meeting of priests a week ago to further that process.

In 2017, the Parish Pastoral Plan was enacted – when we (Holy Rosary and St John's) became officially partnered (rather than "merged"), although our parishes had been living that reality for years before. The Meitler firm had helped gather and organize the data and made recommendations, which were later tweaked and finalized. The Catholic schools, faith formation, vocation efforts, and central office restructuring were also addressed as part of this multi-pronged effort. The last part has been incremental, but ongoing.

Last year, Bishop Persico and the Worship Office had us reflect upon liturgical renewal and Eucharistic renewal — and one of the results was the posture of kneeling before and after Communion which synchronized our Diocese with the more universal practice. This year, the U.S. Bishops will promulgate their letter on Eucharistic renewal, which will give us all more to reflect upon. We are reminded that our true goal is salvation of souls — to help people better know, love, and serve God. And not just those who are presently part of our parish.

To enter this third phase of parish pastoral planning, which can be complex and multi-layered, the consulting firm, Meitler, will again be engaged. We must continue to respond to the resources available and re-think how we can do things in the future.

The top priority will be care of souls – not maintaining buildings and institutions. We must honor and revere the people who are treasured by God, respecting the character and uniqueness of each parish community – particularly its members. Everything we do ought to draw people closer to Christ. Are we focused on maintenance or mission? Preservation or Evangelization?

We should not get stuck on issues of finances or priest availability – and should zero in on parish vitality. We hope to improve our communication – for example, in fairness we need more priests in the eastern parts of our 13-county diocese. We seem to have no problem with people getting involved in various ministries (such as food pantries and homeless shelters) and what does "belonging" mean to the younger generation (those 40 and under)? It is certainly not the parish loyalty that long existed with those of us older. New wine calls for new wineskins (ways and means of engaging the folks in worship)! It will be a little daunting – and quite exciting! The Holy Spirit will guide us all, we believe, all along the way.

Lent 2022 - Stations of the Cross


The Third Station: Jesus falls for the first time. By Denny Deiner

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, Woman, behold your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.



John 19:25-27

This fourth Station of the Cross, where Jesus meets his mother, can bring me to tears. I try and place myself at the scene with Jesus, three women, and the beloved disciple – five persons altogether - all joined by the love they have for the one that is on the cross. I can't even imagine the anguish Mary felt as she watched her son's suffering and agonizing death. She had been Jesus' mother and disciple all his life. What a painful, unbearable, gut-wrenching hour that must have been; like being at a loved one's deathbed during their last hours. Mary has much in common with loving parents that have had to watch their child, son or daughter, suffer and die. And yet she knew, as she stood at the foot of the cross, watching him hang in agony, that he died for the sins of the world.

Many of us have been there at one time or another, whether we sat with a parent, sibling, friend, or probably the most painful of all, a child, as we shared those final hours. I believe that only those who deeply love the one in pain have the courage to be at his/her side, which explains the presence of the five, particularly Jesus' own mother. I'm sure Jesus gave her the strength to bear her grief just as He is there for us at our darkest moments.
