





What is the best way to deal with the war in Ukraine? In the face of such evil, of course, we pray. Well, why isn't God answering? Why isn't there some way to stop the aggression? To such questions and to my own inner upset at this awful reality, I suggest we turn to the "classic prayers" — and revisit Psalms 13, 44, and 77. When I shared this with a parishioner, she suggested Psalm 37 as well.

"How long, O Lord, will you forget me? ... How long will my enemy triumph over me?" "Now you have rejected and disgraced us: you do not march out with our armies. You make us retreat before the foe; those who hate us plunder us at will." "My sorrow is this, the right hand of the Most High has abandoned us." "The wicked unsheathe their swords; they string their bows to fell the poor and the oppressed, to slaughter those whose way is upright."

"Awake! Why do you sleep, O Lord? Rise up! Do not reject us forever. Why do you hide your face; why forget our pain and misery? For our soul has been humiliated in the dust; our belly is pressed to the earth. Rise up, help us! Redeem us in your mercy!" (Psalm 44:24-27)

The psalms of lament were inspired to give us words to express our truest feelings. May God have mercy on us all.

Book and Basket Tree: All Easter baskets and books should be returned to St. John's by Palm Sunday, April 10th. Please attach the tag to the basket or to the book.


Lent 2022 - Stations of the Cross


It is an uneven cobble stone road up the hill to Golgotha. The heavy timber jolts your bleeding, pain filled body with each step... and then your weakened body
