





The week after Easter (two weeks ago), I headed out to Mount Saviour Monastery (which is in the hills south of Corning, NY). It was time for retreat – I surely needed it and it had the desired effect.

Every year, each deacon and priest is expected to take an extended (four or five day) retreat in order to step aside from the usual demands and let the Lord work on our souls. It involves rest, prayer, and quiet. It may include some spiritual talks given by a leader (we have such scheduled retreats usually in the fall), but it may be directed (as by meeting a spiritual director briefly each day and discussing the movement of the Holy Spirit within) or some enriching reading. It often involves some form of exercise – for me, that's walking. One place, Villa Maria Conference Center, has a swimming pool.

I often take a spring retreat at a monastery and a fall retreat with fellow priests. This year, the latter is ruled out due to a trip I'll be making, so this one "counts" for my annual retreat. Last year, I took five days at Bethany Retreat Center, Frenchville, in January — they had made special provisions to receive retreatants during the COVID pandemic, which the monasteries did not until recently. So, I was really missing the golden opportunities I'd had before. Also, this was good after the intensity of Holy Week and my nephew's death the days prior. I feel as if I have gotten "back on track."

THIS weekend, I'm at Women's Cursillo #258, being hosted by Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Harborcreek. As of today, we have 15 candidates, and being a part of the team has always been a blessing in my life. I encourage people to attend a weekend, even if they already are spiritually charged up, so they have the amazing experience of working one. This is my 28th team!

For those who don't know, <u>Cursillo</u> (or Koinonia or Kairos) is a multi-day experience (I wouldn't call it a retreat) where we review the basics of the faith through talks given by lay people and clergy, and live through a dynamic community in order to make a plan for future faith growth. If we take our relationship with Christ seriously, then it means we should be intentional about our lives, our time, our priorities – and this helps greatly.

Due to COVID-19, the weekend has been re-thought. Instead of arriving on Thursday evening and taking more time in silence, candidates now arrive early Friday morning and leave on Sunday afternoon. For many, it still means taking a day off work (Friday), but those who come have never regretted it. It is a most engaging three days you'll probably ever experience, and there's a plan for "take home," so to preserve the enthusiasm (and perhaps even grow it more!). Many men and women experience this, as well.
