





Who is **Charles de Foucauld** and why am I traveling to Rome for his canonization? This Frenchman was born in 1858 in a prestigious family. Having lost parents and grandparents by age 6, he was an orphan, but a wealthy man. After graduating near the very bottom of his class

from the military academy, he went on to serve as an Army officer and was finally dishonorably discharged for gambling, drinking, womanizing, and bringing disgrace to his unit in Northern Africa. Humiliated, he decided to "go for broke," by exploring those regions of the Sahara, disguised as a rabbi. If he had been caught a Christian, he would have likely been killed. He submitted his findings to the French Geographic Society and won the gold medal.

But it did not satisfy him. At age 28, he sought out a priest he knew for spiritual direction in his radical "conversion" experience and reconciliation. He toured the Holy Land, sought the lowest place and so joined the Trappists, first in France, and then in a poor abbey in Syria. But they weren't ascetic enough. He gave away much of his wealth and became a gardener in a Franciscan Sisters' cloistered convent in Nazareth. Praying and memorizing the gospels, he returned to France at his director's call to complete his studies for ordination he had begun as a Trappist.

Ordained as a diocesan priest at age 42, but for exclusively missionary duties, he openly returned to the Northern Sahara to minister to the people but assisted for a while as a military chaplain. He then went far into the wilderness five years later to Tamanrasset among the Tuoreg people. He was finally accepted by them, provided to hospitality to travelers, and prayed intensely. He rarely celebrated Eucharist (at the time, private Masses were forbidden) unless someone visited, or when he paid an Arab boy to serve. He envisioned a community of men and women (Little Brothers / Little Sisters of Jesus), but his rule was far too strict to be attractive. An insurgency erupted, and some young men looking for weapons came upon him and inadvertently killed him on Dec 1, 1916.

He was almost completely unknown, but for a few who picked up his amazing writings, re-imagined the communities that were eventually founded, and then adapted also for diocesan priests — into Jesus Caritas priest fraternities, of which I have been a part since my ordination in 1983. I never imagined that he would be considered for sainthood, due to his very checkered past. But the Jesus Caritas priests in France organized a set of "statutes" (to get official Church recognition) and others worked for his beatification — which occurred in 2005. He will be proclaimed a "Saint" next Sunday, May 15th, in St Peter Square, by Pope Francis. I plan to be there.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments


