





#### Palm Sunday

Holy Week 2023 is upon us already with the celebration of Palm Sunday this week. So much can be said about each of the days, (and will be!), but the true beauty of this week is experienced in the Liturgical celebrations each day. Holy Thursday Mass will be very special as Fr. Bill will celebrate the mass in this 40<sup>th</sup> year of his priesthood. Good Friday has always been a sacred day for me, one I try to spend in silence to contemplate Our Lord's Passion. And of course Jesus' Holy Mother Mary suffered right along with Him, as was foretold by the prophet Simeon in the Temple: "A sword shall pierce your heart..." (Luke 2:35).

The Passion of Jesus and Mary is so moving that it inspired the creation of what many consider the greatest work of art ever to be made: Michelangelo's Pieta.

I would like to share one of my favorite poems from the great English writer Hilaire Belloc that for me sums up the Passion and Love of Jesus and Mary:



They warned Our Lady for the Child That was Our Blessed Lord, And She took Him into the desert wild, Over the camel's ford.

And a long song She sang to Him And a short story told: And she wrapped Him in a woolen cloak To keep Him from the cold.

But when Our Lord was grown a man The rich they dragged Him down, And they crucified Him in Golgotha, Out and beyond the town.

They crucified Him on Calvary, Upon an April day; And because He had been Her little Son She followed Him all the way.

Our Lady stood beside the Cross, A little space apart, And when She heard Our Lord cry out A sword went through her heart.

They laid Our Lord in a marble tomb, Dead, in a winding sheet.
But Our Lady stands above the world With the white moon at her feet.

#### Reflection

On March 18<sup>th</sup>, Father David held a Spanish Women's Retreat in Pastors' Hall for over fifty women. Describing the retreat, he said that in addition to Mass there would be some talks, small group discussions and a Holy Hour. Fr. David asked if I would help with the Holy Hour, with the theme of the woman who was cured by touching the hem of Jesus' garment.

Of course, I said I would be happy to help and thought this would be a great topic for my Lenten reflection. Here is a little background as to why this was a perfect topic.

In June of 2018, Mary and I traveled to the Holy Land and one of the sites we visited was Magdala, home to the beautiful Duc In Altum, located on the shores of the Sea of Galilee.

Duc In Altum, which provides a place for worship, mass, and prayer, draws its name from Luke 5:4 where Jesus instructs Simon Peter to "launch into the deep." The building is composed of six chapels, including the main boat chapel, four smaller lateral mosaic chapels, an atrium dedicated to women; as well as the lower-level Encounter Chapel.

The Encounter Chapel, shown to the right, was painted by Daniel Cariola and titled "Encounter." The painting portrays one of the most significant miracles in the gospel: "... because she thought, 'If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed.' Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she



was freed from her suffering." (Mark 5:28-29).

This Gospel story unfolds in Capernaum near the Sea of Galilee. Jesus was teaching when he was approached by a man identified as a worker in the local synagogue. He came to Jesus in distress, begging for a visit to his home where his 12-year-old daughter was sick unto death. Jesus immediately moved in the direction of this man's house.

The crowd he was teaching went with him. A woman in the crowd was seeking to be delivered from a 12-year illness. Her journey of healing took her to every doctor she knew and every cure, whether legitimate or not. Scripture says she was now broke. Jesus was her last hope so she creeped behind Jesus, believing that if she touched his clothes, she would receive healing. And she did.

As soon as she received healing, Jesus stopped dead in his tracks. "Who touched me?" he asked. The woman was both afraid and ashamed to come forward but as Jesus gave her his attention, she explained everything that had happened to her. Jesus responded positively, telling her that her faith had healed her.

I share this story because during the Holy Hour, the women were invited to kneel in front of the Blessed Sacrament, touch the fringe of the Humeral Veil that enveloped the Monstrance and ask for healing.

This was a very powerful experience for me as I witnessed, one after another, these beautiful women clutching the Humeral Veil and silently asking Jesus to heal their brokenness through their tears. I was privileged to see their faces as many of the burdens they carried were lifted from them.

I came across the following saying: "When you are hanging on by a thread, make sure it's the hem of his garment." How many times in our lives have we been hanging on just by a thread.

This week we celebrate the Easter Triduum unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery, may we allow ourselves to reach out and touch the hem of Jesus' garment and allow ourselves to be healed.
