



Liturgical Corner By Deacon Marc & Delphine Leaderstorf

The readings for this weekend, the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time, begin with a warning for the Shepherds – basically anyone serving in any ministerial role. We must follow God's ways in bringing others to The Shepherd. It clearly indicates that Our True Shepherd, will tend his flock. He is in charge; He will see that we are not lost. Following Jeremiah words, we are given the words of Psalm 23 – The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. In the psalm, He shows his tender love and care for us. Yes, even in these unknown times we have fears and concerns – yet The Lord is tending to every detail of our lives. He wants us to be confident in His pre3sence among us. He came and is still among us – reconciling us with the Father by His death on the cross. He conquered death, brings us peace and hope. We work tirelessly to continue bringing peach and hope to our world, our families our parishes. Working in this way, we all just like the Apostles in Marks Gospel need to be refreshed as we do this extension of bringing Christ to others. We all need time to "get away" with Scripture to meditate and be sure of the path God is calling us to. In writing this, I came across this meditation from Pope Francis. I pray it speaks to you as it did to me.

Invited to "Come Away" with Him

Christ is alive! We need to keep reminding ourselves of this, because we can risk seeing Jesus Christ simply as a fine model from the distant past, as a memory, as someone who saved us two thousand years ago. But that would be of no use to us: it would leave us unchanged, it would not set us free. The one who fills us with his grace, the one who liberates us, transforms us, heals and consoles us is someone fully alive. He is the Christ, risen from the dead, filled with supernatural life and energy, and robed in boundless light. That is why Saint Paul could say: If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile.

Alive, he can be present in your life at every moment, to fill it with light and to take away all sorrow and solitude. Even if all others depart, he will remain, as he promised: I am with you always, to the end of the age. Because he lives, there can be no doubt that goodness will have the upper hand in your life and that all our struggles will prove worthwhile. If this is the case, we can stop complaining and look to the future, for with him this is always possible. That is the certainty we have. Jesus is eternally alive. If we hold fast to him, we will have life, and be protected from the threats of death and violence that may assail us in life. Every other solution will prove inadequate and temporary. It may be helpful for a time, but once again we will find ourselves exposed and abandoned before the storms of life. With Jesus, on the other hand, our hearts experience a security that is firmly rooted and enduring. Saint Paul says that he wishes to be one with Christ in order to know him and the power of his Resurrection. That power will constantly be revealed in your lives too, for he came to give you life, and life in abundance. If in your heart you can learn to appreciate the beauty of this message, if you are willing to encounter the Lord, if you are willing to let him love you and save you, if you can make friends with him and start to talk to him, the living Christ, about the realities of your life, then you will have a profound experience capable of sustaining your entire Christian life.

A Word from Today's Scriptures



SCHOOL NEWS



RECENT MASS AND LITURGICAL CHANGES: Due to the most recent guidance from the diocese, the following changes are in effect as of 6/18:

•All ropes have been removed from the pews.

•Wearing masks inside church is now optional, except for those distributing Communion during the Communion procession.

•Our Mass live-streams are now limited to two weekend Masses per week - the 4 pm Mass and one Sunday Mass.

•All Masses will continue to be broadcast to FM 88.9 in the parking lot and a minister will come out to distribute communion.
