Did you ever hear this before? On Christmas Eve in 1906, Reginald Fessenden, a radio pioneer and former colleague of Thomas Edison, was experimenting with a microphone and the telegraph. As he was transmitting, he used his own rendition of "O Holy Night", the first song ever broadcast over the radio.



### The Holy Human Family

God gives us a Holy Family that is human in its imperfection. The family we venerate today is not one of wealth or privilege but a family that from the beginning is beset by problems: a crisis pregnancy, a traumatic childbirth, a flight for their lives to a foreign land, a resettling in an unfamiliar town. Yet this family is the spiritual role model for all families, because the thing

they get right is love.

The story of the Holy Family inspires us to dwell in the homes we create for our own holy families. We will surely face problems and challenges, but the way we love is how our children learn to love and trust in the holiness of all God's family. When we honor each other and treat each other with respect, our branch of the family tree grows healthy and hardy. We show how to heed God's tender call.

As much as I struggle with the gender-bound roles outlined by St. Paul and other biblical writers (e.g., "fruitful vine in the recesses"), I am heartened by Paul's advice to all God's children: "put on . . . compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience," and practice forgiveness and gratitude. These are wise and worthy goals for both parents and children. "And over all these," Paul writes, "put on love." There is no better recipe for raising a holy family. - Valerie Schultz

## "IT IS IN GIVING THAT WE RECEIVE" BUT DO WE SOMETIMES MISS THE POINT?

Christmas brings out the best in us—especially when it comes to giving. We like to think of ourselves as basically decent, charitable people, and this season moves the hearts of even the "Scroogiest" among us to generosity and kindness.

But despite our emphasis on giving at Christmas, what we celebrate is about the blessedness of "receiving".

Receiving is hard for most of us. Giving manifests our competence and self-sufficiency—not bad things in themselves. But to receive—that's another dynamic entirely. To receive is to admit our own poverty: that we can't do everything ourselves. To receive with an open and grateful heart requires humility: that there are limits to our power, that we don't have all the answers, that we are indebted to others for the wisdom and support they provide. To receive inspires gratitude: another's gift is a sign that we are loved.

We are better givers than "getters."

What brings us ere on the midst of our holiday giving frenzy is the realization that we are the receivers at Christmas. In all the Gospels, God is the only one who is truly giving, because He is giving us Himself.
