Feast of Saint Anne—July 26

The most significant thing about Saint Anne, was her great holiness and favor that led to her participation with Saint Joachim in the Immaculate Conception and her very early formation of the Blessed Mother. We don't know much about St. Anne with certainty as she isn't directly mentioned in Scripture. We have a reliable account of additional details about St. Anne from a private revelation given to use by Ven. Mary of Agreda (Mystical City of God).

According to this account, St. Gabriel would appear to Anne while she was enrapt in prayer and contemplation. Not unlike the Annunciation, Gabriel made known her nearing conception. St. Anne responds to God with the utmost

humility and submissiveness:

I acknowledge myself, O Lord, a creature unworthy of such mercies and benefits. ... Use me, O Lord, according to thy will, since to it I resign myself entirely. I wish to be as completely thy own as such a favor requires; but what shall I do, who am not worthy to be the slave of Her who is to be the Mother of the Only begotten and my Daughter? This I know and shall confess always: that I am a poor creature; but at the feet of thy greatness I await the course of thy mercy, who art a kind Father and the all-powerful God. Make me, O Lord, worthy in thy eyes of the dignity Thou bestows upon me.

Mary of Agreda tells us that Anne conceived when she was 44 years old. As soon as the miracle of this Conception was completed, the holy matron was returned to her former state of sterility never to conceive again.

Catholic Q&A - What are sins of the tongue?

- 1. The Lying Tongue speaking false things with the intention to mislead
- 2. The Flattering Tongue exaggerating the good qualities of others in order to ingratiate ourselves to them, a form of lying
- 3. The Overused Tongue saying far too much, especially concerning things about which we know little
- 4. The Swift Tongue speaking before we should, before we even have all of the information
- 5. The Backbiting Tongue talking about others behind their backs, the secretive injuring of a person's good name. Calumny is outright lying about another person. Detraction is calling unnecessary attention to the faults of others so as to harm their reputations.
- The Tale-bearing Tongue spreading unnecessary (often hurtful) information about others. Tale-bearers spread personal information about others that should not be shared.
- 7. The Cursing Tongue wishing that harm come to others, usually that they be damned
- The Piercing Tongue speaking with unnecessary harshness and severity
- 9. The Silent Tongue not speaking up when we ought to warn people of sin, call them to the Kingdom, and announce the Truth of Jesus Christ. In our age, the triumph of evil and bad behavior has been assisted by our silence as a Christian people.

Set a guard over my mouth, O LORD; keep watch over the door of my lips (Psalm 141:3).

Dear Parish Family,

I continue below the story of the nuns in the Monastery of St. James the Mutilated. When I visited and spent time at the Monastery, there were six nuns and three monks in the monastery. The nuns came from different countries; Mother Claire was French, and the rest were from Lebanon, Chile, Venezuela, Colombia and one from Syria. There were also associates, all

from Belgium, living in the monastery for a time, some discerning and others volunteering.

I was particularly fond of Sister Merina, the only Syrian nun in the monastery. She is a petite nun with a kind face and beautiful eyes. I asked her about life during the war and without missing a beat she exclaimed jubilantly that she is here today because of Our Lady. Her cheerfulness was contagious. She stated that Our Lady saved her from a bomb. She pronounced Our Lady's name with such tenderness that indicated love for and dependence on the Blessed Virgin. I could tell she loved the Blessed Virgin very much and that warmed my heart immensely. She went on to narrate to me how she survived a bomb. [To be continued]

St. James, Apostle St. James, brother of St. John, and son of Zebedee, was a native of Bethsaida in Galilee. He is surnamed the Greater, i.e. the elder. After the Ascension of Jesus Christ to heaven, says the office of to-day, James preached His divinity in Judea and Samaria. He soon betook himself to Spain. When he returned to Jerusalem, Herod Agrippa, desiring to please the Jews, condemned him to death and he was beheaded towards the year 42, a short time before the feast of Easter. It would seem, that for fear of the Arabs who were masters of Jerusalem, the body of the Saint was later carried to Compostella, in Spain, where he is later carried to Compostella, in Spain, where he is greatly honoured. July 25 recalls the date of this translation. His name is inscribed in the Canon of the Mass with that of St. John, his brother

St Anne, Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary As her name signifies, grace was poured on her and she was blessed by God for ever (Communion). "By His grace He made her de-serve to be the mother of the Mother of God" (Collect). The devotion to St. Anne is founded on the bond which unites her to Mary and to the Lacernate Wood. Its account livery founded on the bond which unites her to Mary and to the Incarnate Word. Its ancient liturgy dates from the sixth century for the East and the eighth century for the West. It was authorized by Urban IV in 1378. In 1584 Gregory XIII fixed July 26 as date of the feast and Leo XIII in 1879 extended it to the whole Church

St Pantaleon, Martyr At Nicomedia, says the Roman Martyrology, was martyred St. Pantaleon, a doctor, who having been arrested on account of his faith by order of the Emperor Maximian, was tortured on the rack and burned with flaming torches; he was consoled in his torments by an apparition of our Lord; the sword put an end to his glorious combat. This was under Diocletlim about A.D. 303. St. Pantaleon is numbered by the Greeks among the great martyrs. Medical men honour him, after St. Luke, as their principal pa-tron. He is one of the "fourteen auxiliary saints".

SS. Nazarius and Celsus Martyrs; Nazarius, baptized by Pope St. Linus at Rome, in his turn baptized young Celsus betook themselves to Milan, where they were arrested by the pagans and beheaded about the year 68. In 395 their bodies were discovered and in the tomb of St. Nazarius was found a phial of his blood as red as if it had been shed that very day.
Victor I, Pope and Martyr; born in Africa, succeeded St. Eleutherius, on the pontifical throne. Innocent I, Pope and Confessor was born at Albano and was a contemporary of St. Augustine and of St. Jerome.

St. Martha, Virgin After having celebrated on the 22nd of this month the feast of St. Mary Magdalen, we honour to-day Martha, her sister.
