- 2. Mass attendance currently we do not have any mass at either location that fills more than 30% of the church. That means 70% of the church is empty. Our highest attended mass last weekend had 110 people. Looking at the work of the Renewal we need to ask ourselves, what are we doing about this? As I drive between the parishes, I see countless young people. Young adults, young families, I see more established individuals and families as well, and I do not see any of them in our churches. Are we reaching out and inviting? Are we welcoming people we might not recognize at mass? Over the next few weeks we are going to talk about how to invite and welcome others to let our communities know that we are here and have the greatest thing to offer them; Jesus!
- 3. Renewal sometimes renewal can be something that scares us because it makes the future seem uncertain. Our first Transition Team meeting was last Saturday and it was a very good meeting. The task of the Transition team over the next six months is to come up with a Pastoral plan for our families. We will be covering the topics of: Liturgy/Mass Schedule, Spiritual Life, Administration, Outreach, Education (Catholic Schools and Faith Formation), Stewardship. This Pastoral plan will affect ALL of the parishes in our family and should help us have a very positive direction moving forward.
- 4. Bulletin last week because of a factor beyond our control, we had one bulletin between the two parishes that had different covers. As parishes moving forward as a family, we need to do better at collaborating together. We will be pursuing bringing the bulletins together with a new look and format. Some have told me that the bulletin is part of the identity of the individual parishes. Speaking plainly, our identity is in the person of Jesus Christ, and he continually invited people to come together.
- I know it can seem like things are going fast, but as I've shared in previous columns, we need to respond now so that we have a church for the future. Please continue to pray for our parishes, the Renewal and let's make Holy Spirit and St. Margaret's the model of what it means to be 'family'!
