

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

The Christmas holiday season is over, and it is a **good time to be attentive to God's presence** in the ordinary occurrences of daily life. In this weekend's Gospel reading we see **Jesus attending a wedding at Cana**, a special event in the life of a family, but a fairly common experience in the life of the community at large. This event becomes the opportunity for Jesus to perform his first miracle in the Gospel of John. It is the "beginning of His signs" that reveal more fully who He is and "His disciples began to believe in Him." Jesus responds to the needs of the people with abundance, providing good wine overflowing for those who turned to Him. Jesus was there all along, but the people did not acknowledge their need for Jesus until they realized that they had no wine.

Often in life, we fail to realize our need for God until we are running on empty. In our want, we call out to God who is always there. At times different events awaken us to God's presence. Fr. Ron Rolheiser. OMI, relates that Victor Frankl, the author of *Man's Search for Meaning*, had such a moment when he had been clinically dead for a few minutes before he was revived by doctors. As Frankl returned to ordinary life, everything became very rich for him. "One very important aspect of post-mortem life is that everything gets precious, gets piercingly important. You get stabbed by things, by flowers and by babies and by beautiful things – just the very act of living, of walking of breathing and eating and having friends and chatting. Everything seems to look more beautiful rather than less, and one gets the much-intensified sense of miracles."

God is present to us every day, transforming the ordinary into something extraordinary. As Jesus turned water into wine at Cana, miracles are happening all around us daily. In prayer we can become more attentive to those day-to-day miracles as Fr. Rolheiser relates: "The secret to prayer is not to try to make God present, but to make ourselves present to God. The secret to finding beauty and love in life is the same. Like God, they are already present. The trick is to make ourselves present to them." May we become more aware of God's miracles existing around us this week and throughout this Ordinary Time!

The donation is \$15 per Mass.



<u>First Reading</u>: *Is 62:1-5* The prophet Isaiah used marriage imagery (bridge and groom) to describe the Lord's love for His people, Israel. What do you see as some implications of this marriage imagery?

Second Reading: 1 Cor 12:4-11 Paul taught the Corinthians that the individual gifts of the Holy

Spirit are meant to benefit and unify the community of faith. How do you use your spiritual gifts within your faith community?

Gospel: Jn 2:1-11

Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana was one of the first public "signs" he performed revealing his divinity. It also showed Jesus' compassion, sparing the family shame at running short of wine. How do you imagine the family reacted to Jesus' intervention and rescue?
