From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

I am sure that most of us shared the pain of the Buffalo Bills' loss to the Kansas City Chiefs in the Divisional Playoff game this past Sunday evening. It was a roller coaster of emotions, and certainly one of the most exciting games in NFL history. The last two minutes were particularly chaotic with fantastic plays by both offenses. When the Bills went ahead 36 to 33 with 13 seconds to go in the 4th Quarter, many of us were making plans for the AFC Championship Game in Orchard Park this weekend and then moving onto the Superbowl. We were so very close. Unfortunately, the game was far from over. What else can I say? Even my "lucky socks" were not enough to pull off a victory. I am sure that we all have ideas on how the Bills could have sealed the victory in those last 13 seconds, but it does not change the end result. It was painful, and we can go on forever with "what ifs." However, it is time to move on and be grateful for the improvements that were made this past year of ups and downs in the Bills' season. At least Tom Brady lost this past weekend as well.

Liturgically this week, it is the Fourth Week in Ordinary Time. Yet, there are a couple of feasts that happen this week to which I would like to call your attention. On Wednesday, February 2, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. In many traditions, this feast is the end of the Christmas Season, and it has a strong connection to Christmas. The feast commemorates Mary and Joseph following the observance of the law by bringing their child Jesus to the Temple to consecrate him to the Lord. In the Temple they meet the righteous Simeon and prophetess Anna who have longed to see the fulfillment of God's promise to Israel to send a Messiah. They encounter Jesus, and their dreams are complete as they recognize him as the promised one. Simeon in Luke's account of the gospel proclaims Jesus to be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." This recognition connects the feast very much with Christmas and Epiphany where it is stressed that Jesus is the light of the world. It is also the reason why the Feast of the Presentation became known as "Candlemas Day" when traditionally candles are blessed to be used in the church throughout the year and processions with candles are held in churches and in the streets on this day.

The day after the Feast of the Presentation (Thursday, February 3) is **the Memorial to St. Blaise with the Blessing of Throats.** We will have the Blessing of Throats at each Mass on Thursday as well a special prayer service with our school children. For those who are not able to make the blessing on Thursday we will be blessing throats after all the Masses on the weekend following, i.e. February 5 & 6 for all who desire.



Dear Parishioners and Friends,


Happy New Year! I hope that 2022 brings much happiness and good health for all!



Saint of the Week

St. Blaise | February 3

St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. ©LPi
