From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Alleluia! Jesus has risen! I wish all a very Happy and Blessed Easter! Welcome to everyone as we celebrate the most blessed day of the year. Easter is the reason that we gather each Sunday as a community of believers, and it is wonderful to be here at Queen of Heaven to commemorate this feast. It is great to see so many celebrating Easter at our Parish: our regulars, college and university students who might be home for the holiday, guests, others who may have been away for a variety of reasons, young, old, middle aged, anyone who is here to celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death with us this Easter day! Saint of the Week

St. Anslem April 24

St. Anselm of Canterbury left his home in Italy to travel as a young man & ended up at the monastery in France. Anselm rose quickly to become abbot of the community and his writings are now compared in importance to those of St. Augustine.

In 1093 Anselm was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury. Anselm, spent much of his time as Archbishop exiled in Rome.

St. Anselm's teachings and works of theology are his most important contribution to the Catholic faith. He is considered of the fathers of scholastic theology and his chief achievement in philosophy was the ontological argument for the existence of God. His work Cur Deus homo? taught that atonement for sins could only be achieved through Christ. He was canonized in 1494 and named a Doctor of the Church in 1720 ©LPi

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43 We hear in the reading from Acts some of the earliest proclamations from Peter about his witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. To whom in your life should you bear witness to the resurrected Christ?

Second Reading: Col 3:1-4 or 1 Cor 5:6b-8 Using the image of unleavened bread, Paul urges the believers in Corinth to see the resurrection of Jesus as an opportunity to start anew. What needs renewal in your life?

Gospel: Jn 20:1-9 or Lk 24:1-12 or, Lk 24:13-35 The apostles did not initially believe the witness of Mary Magdalene and the other women to news of the resurrection of Jesus. Why do you think so many people today still doubt this good news?
