From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

In case you were wondering where your Pastor was last weekend, this is what happened: On the morning of Thursday, April 21 I was not feeling up to par, so I decided to do a COVID-19 test. Unfortunately, the test was positive. This meant that I had to isolate myself in my rooms at the Rectory for five full days. Physically, I only had a mild case of the virus, experiencing symptoms more similar to a cold than anything else. However, I had to find Priests who could cover all our Masses and other sacramental responsibilities at Queen of Heaven while I was in guarantine and Fr. Denning was out of town. This is not the easiest thing to do these days, but we are fortunate to have many Priests who were willing to help us out. Over those five days, we had ten different Priests from throughout the Diocese come to our Parish to cover our sacramental needs. They presided at 13 Masses, two funerals and two baptisms along with administering the Sacrament of Penance to those who came on Saturday afternoon. I write this to thank all those Priests who stepped up to help us when needed. We must realize how fortunate we are to have so many good Priests in the area to help us out. I also thank our Rectory, School and Faith Formation staffs, Seminarian James, and our Deacons for carrying on without me during this time. I thank particularly our Parish Secretary and Receptionist, Patti Waszak and her husband Jerry who provided food and other deliveries to my suite's door so that I could survive during the time of guarantine. Thank you to all who offered their prayers for me and the Parish during this time as well. The recent upsurge in the virus certainly has been a concern. I hear of new cases almost daily. Thankfully, I am now back. I will continue to pray for those families that have been much more severely impacted by COVID-19 and other health issues right now.

It's hard to believe that May is here! With the coming of May many traditions take place in our Church. First, May is the Month of Mary. Second, it is the month for the celebration of First Holy Communions in our Parish. The first one is this Sunday, May 1 at our 9:30 a.m. Mass. Next weekend, another group of children will be making their First Communion at the 5:30 p.m. Saturday Mass, and the last two groups will be celebrating their First Communion on Sunday, May 15 at the 9:30 and 11:15 a.m. Masses. It is wonderful to see the children and their families on this important occasion, and we look forward to all of them sharing with us in the Eucharist throughout the year. Another tradition is the May Crowning, where we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Queen of Heaven in a special ceremony. This year we will have our special Parish wide May Crowning on Sunday, May 22. All are invited. We invite particularly the First Communion Class to put their First Communion clothes on again and join us with their families. The ceremony will begin in Church following our 11:15 a.m. Sunday Mass. Weather permitting, we will process outside to crown the large statue of Mary outside of the Parish Hall. Make sure that you place the May Crowning Ceremony on your calendar today!



Saint of the Week

St. Rose of Venerini May 7

The story of St. Rose is one of having faith in God and his calling in your life. Born in Italy in 1656, she was the daughter of a doctor. Following the death of her fiancé, she entered a convent in the hopes of becoming a nun, but soon returned home to care for her mother. In an effort to keep up her spiritual side, St. Rose invited women of the neighborhood to recite the rosary in her home, and together they formed a sodality. Unsure of where her life was headed and after much contemplation, she admitted to feeling called to be a teacher in the world, rather than a nun in a convent. Eventually, she moved ahead and opened a free school for girls in 1685. Eventually, she was invited to oversee the training of teachers and the administration of schools in the Diocese of Montefiascone, which then led to being called upon to organize schools in many parts of Italy, including Rome.

St. Rose died in Rome in 1728 amid a number of miracles that many credit to her. St. Rose was beatified in 1952 and canonized in 2006.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK



Mational Day of Prayer May 5, 2022
