# From the Pastor's Desk

### Dear Parishioners,

These past few weeks have been busy with a number of our young people receiving sacraments. I want to take some time here to congratulate these young people and their families and to thank all of our staff and Parishioners who were a part of the different ceremonies. First, we celebrated **the Sacrament of Confirmation on Wednesday, April 27**. It was planned that Fr. Peter Karalus, Vicar General for the Diocese of Buffalo, would be here to celebrate Confirmation with us, but he ended up testing positive for COVID two days before. Consequently, Fr. Eugene Ulrich, our local Vicar Forane, was delegated by Bishop Fisher to come and confer the Sacrament of Confirmation upon 36 of our young adults, and it all worked out wonderfully. It was a great spirit-filled celebration, and I thank all those who were involved, particularly our Faith Formation Staff, the Knights of St. John, and our Ladies Sodality who put on a spectacular reception afterward.

This past Sunday, May 1, was our first celebration of **First Holy Communion** in our Parish this year, and once again everything was great. Twelve young people received Jesus for the first time at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. It was another beautiful experience of God's grace and just the first of four First Holy Communion celebrations at Queen of Heaven this year. The second one will take place this Saturday, May 7 at the 5:30 p.m. Mass, and the last two groups will be celebrating their First Communion on Sunday, May 15 at the 9:30 and 11:15 a.m. Masses. Once again, I thank all those involved in the First Communions, the families and friends of the children, Knights of St. John, Faith Formation Staff, Music Ministry and all those present who helped make the celebrations truly uplifting and grace-filled moments.

This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter that is traditionally known as **Good Shepherd Sunday.** The name comes from the tenth chapter of St. John's Gospel where Jesus identifies himself as the good shepherd, and we hear from this chapter on this Fourth Sunday of Easter in each of the three years of our liturgical cycle of readings. This year we are in cycle C, and today's gospel passage is called by many, "the finale and high point of the Good Shepherd Discourse." Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." Jesus and the Father are one, joining together to protect the flock, safely keeping them in their hand.

We also celebrate **Mother's Day this weekend**, and I take this opportunity to wish all of our ladies who are mothers a blessed Mother's Day. I include in this blessing all mothers: living and deceased, birth mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, and anyone who has truly helped to bring us to life at some point in our lives. Some may feel sadness and loss on this day due to various losses of motherhood in their lives. For some it might be the death of a mother, either physically or emotionally, and for others it might be that they have never been able to have a child for which they longed. In any case, we want to thank God this day for all women who have shown us a mother's love in our lives.


Happy Mother's Day! Our Blessed Mother is

mother to us all, and St. Peter Julian Eymard wrote a series of meditations on the Virgin Mary compiled in the book, Month of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament.

He writes: "Mary's adoration was deep, interior, profound. It was the gift of her whole self. She offered herself entirely to the loving services of the Eucharist, for love lays down no conditions, no reservations. It no longer thinks of self, no longer lives for self. It is a stranger to itself, and it lives only for the God whom it loves. All in Mary turned toward the Blessed Sacrament as toward its centre and end. A current of grace and love was established between the Heart of Jesus in the Host and the heart of Mary adoring. They were two flames united into a single one. God was then perfectly adored by His creature!"

Saint of the Week

St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'l *May 10* 

Born Joseph de Veuster in Tremelo, Belgium, he quit school at 13 so he could work on the family farm. Feeling called for more, however, he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later. His brother, a priest from the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to his assigned location. Damien quickly volunteered in his place and found himself on the Hawaiian Islands in 1864. Two months after arriving, he was ordained a priest of Honolulu and assigned to the Island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he visited the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'I, where he petitioned to stay permanently to care for their physical, medical, and spiritual needs. After years of working to improve their location and those who lived there, he contracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. St. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009.

# QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK

First Reading: Acts 13:14, 43-52 We hear today how Paul and Barnabas were met with resistance and hostility in Pisidian Antioch on their first missionary journey. How do you not get discouraged when your spiritual journey is difficult?

Second Reading: Rv 7:9, 14b-17 During John's vision of heaven, he often has "one of the elders" teach him about the vision he is seeing. Who has been a good spiritual guide for you? <u>Gospel</u>: Jn 10:27-30 Jesus speaks of an unbreakable solidarity between him and those who follow him ("my sheep"). In what ways do you experience this unity with Jesus already in your faith?



For those of us who are Catholic, we believe in the power of vocations to help spread the Gospel message. The vocations to priesthood, or the deaconate, or religious life are at the center of our efforts to spread the good news.

However, we need to also speak about the vocation of married life as service to the church; and furthermore, the vocation of single life. It is at our baptism that we are given the mandate to spread the Gospel through our vocation in the church.

We hear in Scripture that Jesus stands at the door of our heart and knocks. He only invites and never demands or breaks into our lives without our acceptance. He knocks, we open the door, and the invitation and welcome are complete.

#### Let us pray...

God of the invitation, you knock upon the door of everyone's heart.

We seek the courage to open that door, for we know the responsibility of saying yes. We humbly ask you for your wisdom to serve your church with compassion and acceptance. We believe that when we say yes, you will provide the grace for the work ahead. Give grace to those men and women who have dedicated their lives to constant service to your church. Also give grace to those couples and single men and women who work for the church in their secular lives. We ask all this through Christ our Lord and brother, who live and reign with you and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
