

# From the Pastor's Desk

### Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend Fr. Thomas Quinlivan, our Pastor Emeritus, celebrated the 50th Anniversary of his Ordination to the Priesthood. Fr. Tom wanted to celebrate the event quietly without fanfare. However, I did want to take this opportunity to thank Fr. Tom publicly for his 50 years of dedicated service as a Priest in the Diocese of Buffalo and in particular for his won-derful contributions to Queen of Heaven as Pastor from 1998 until 2015. Fr. Tom and his sisters stopped by Queen of Heaven this past Tuesday afternoon during our School's dismissal. I am not sure if they also visited Kone King, but he is doing well and passes on his good wishes to all. Congratulations again to Fr. Tom! Thank you for your service to God and His people as Priest!

Do not forget! Next Sunday, May 22 we will be having a Parish wide May Crowning here at Queen of Heaven. We invite everyone to join us for the event and especially encourage this year's First Communion Class to dress up in their First Communion outfits for the procession and crowning of our Blessed Mother, the Queen of Heaven. The ceremony will begin in Church following our 11:15 a.m. Sunday Mass, rain or shine. Weather permitting, we will process to crown the large statue of Mary outside of the Parish Hall. In the case of inclement weather, we will still have a crowning ceremony, but it will be inside the Church with a smaller statue.

I need to give everyone an update on the progress of our 2022 Catholic Charities Appeal which has exceeded the \$100,000 mark since I last reported on it. As of this past Tuesday, I am happy to report that 371 donors have given \$108,656.86 to this year's Catholic Charities Appeal. This is great progress, but we still have a way to go to reach our goal of \$137,411. Fortunately, the campaign goes until June 30, so we have a little more than six weeks to make it. Thank you to all those who have generously contributed to this year's appeal. If you have yet to do so, please consider giving what you are able. Your gift to Catholic Charities multiplies itself many times over in service to those in need. Finally, I want to give some words of gratitude to our Seminarian James Bobak who has spent this past year with us on his Pastoral year. Next weekend, May 21-22 is James' last official weekend stationed at Queen of Heaven. We thank James for all of his service here, and we will miss his widespread presence with us. This Summer, he will be ministering at Sister's Hospital in Buffalo, doing the Clinical Pastoral Education Program there. It is a very intensive program so most of his energies will be tied up with his hospital ministry. Nevertheless, he will be still residing at Queen of Heaven with Fr. Denning and myself during his CPE experience. Consequently, we are not quite saying goodbye to James just yet. We will figure out how to give him a more proper farewell at some point before the end of the Summer.





St. Margaret of Cortona May 16

Though St. Margaret of Cortona is today known as being an incredibly pious Catholic, she didn't start out that way. Born into a farming family in Laviano, Tuscany, her mother died when St. Margaret was seven. Her father remarried, but life with her stepmother was so difficult that St. Margaret moved out of the home and instead chose to live with a man named Arsenio, though they weren't married. They had been living together for nine years when she gave birth to a son. Knowing in her heart that this wasn't the life that God intended for her to have, she prayed for purity.

One day while waiting for Arsenio, his dog led her into the forest where she found Arsenio murdered. So shocked was St. Margaret that she fell into a life of penance. She and her son returned to Laviano, but still found her stepmother to be as unwelcoming as ever. They then went to Cortona, and eventually her son became a friar.

Three years after her conversion, St. Margaret followed in her son's footsteps and became a Franciscan tertiary. During her life, St. Margaret established a hospital and founded a congregation of tertiary sisters. She was canonized in 1728. ©LPi
