

From the Pastor's Desk


Dear Parishioners,

This past week certainly has been gut wrenching for many as we struggle to deal with **the horrible tragedy of a mass shooting at the Tops store on Jefferson Avenue** in Buffalo. The anger and hatred that fueled that senseless calamity certainly stand in striking contrast to the gospel message of Jesus that we hear each time we come to Church. Last Sunday's Gospel was most striking as we heard Jesus giving us "a new commandment: love one another." In these difficult days, may our thoughts and actions be guided by following the example of Jesus' sacrificial love for all!

This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, often called Ascension Thursday. In the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, it records that Jesus presented himself to his disciples during a forty-day period following his resurrection. He promised that they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit in a few days. They would receive power when the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they were to be his witnesses in Jerusalem and to the ends of the earth. After Jesus had said this, he was lifted up and taken from their sight. Ascension Thursday, therefore, is celebrated forty days after Easter, and the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples is commemorated ten days later on Pentecost. Ascension Thursday is a Holy Day of Obligation, and we have four Masses to celebrate the Holy Day at Queen of Heaven. On Wednesday, May 25 we will have a 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass, and on Thursday, May 26, Masses will be at 7:00, 8:30, and 11:30 a.m. It is important to note that the second Mass on Thursday, May 26 is at 8:30 a.m. This will be the Mass attended by our school children, and it is at 8:30 a.m. instead of the usual 9:00 to accommodate their schedule that day as they will be having their annual picnic following Mass. Please note that the back parking lot will be closed during the picnic. Consequently, all those coming to the 11:30 a.m. Mass that day will need to enter the parking lot from our Mill street entrance.

Next week **Monday, May 30 is Memorial Day** in the United States. It is a federal holiday and a special day for remembrance of those who have died in the service of our country. Originally called Decoration Day from the tradition of decorating graves, it was first widely observed to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers on May 30, 1868. After World War I it became a holiday honoring all who died defending our country in times of war, and it became more widely established as a national holiday throughout the United States. On Memorial Day we are having **a special Memorial Day Mass** to which all are invited. It will be the only Parish Mass that day, similar to what we do on Thanksgiving Day. **The Memorial Day Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. in the Church**, and it is a great opportunity for us to gather to honor and pray for those who have gone before us sacrificing their lives in dedicated service of our country.

St. Rita of Cascia May 22

St. Rita of Cascia had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow, and eventually, member of a religious community.

Born in central Italy, St. Rita felt the calling to become a nun, but was pressured at a young age into marriage. During her 18-year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons died, St. Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status as a widow caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows.

Throughout her lifetime, St. Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ's passion, and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel.
