

CALL TO HOLINESS

“The Gospel is our full wedding partner. It always tells us the truth, and loves us through ‘things’ till we arrive somewhere new and good and much more spacious and holy.” The Gospel will always tell us the whole truth and nothing but the truth, whether we want to hear it or not. For those who are married or in a long time friendship, they will understand; how easy it is for your spouse/friend to tell you the truth about your faults. We are all too quick to return the favor and list the imperfections that need to be corrected. I would hope it is done in love.

When we pray the scriptures and open our hearts to the grace of God’s word, we are quickly unmasked and our imperfections made all too apparent, which is the power of grace through the sacred word. Maybe our response is a quick - BUT!.. Stop and think for a moment...

“What a clever place for God to hide our holiness, so that only the humble and earnest will find it! A ‘perfect’ person ends up being one who can consciously forgive and include imperfection rather than one who thinks he or she is totally above and beyond imperfection.” Therese, the Little Flower, reminds us that all too often it is in our imperfections that God loves us. It is the one place that God is certain to meet us and love us. How do we respond? It would seem easier to go to these places of imperfection in humility to be transformed by Love, than to quickly defend ourselves with the false armor of pride. Reading the scriptures is like having a loving spouse or great friend lead us to the holy ground of transformation - somewhere new and good and much more spacious and holy.

Side note for another column – that is why the Sacrament of Reconciliations is all grace and a holy place to meet our God!

There are various Risk Factors for Breast Cancer:

- ~Drinking alcohol.
- ~Being overweight.
- ~Not being physically active.
- ~Not having children.
- ~Not breastfeeding.
- ~Use of hormone therapy such as for birth control or hormone replacement therapy to treat menopause.
- ~Genetics/hereditary plays a role - Breast cancer, like many other cancers, run in the family.

Women can be tested for the gene that causes breast cancer. Talk with your doctor.

SAINT OF THE DAY

Saint Francis Borgia, October 10

Today's saint grew up in an important family in 16th-century Spain, serving in the imperial court and quickly advancing in his career. But a series of events—including the death of his beloved wife—made Francis Borgia re-think his priorities. He gave up public life, gave away his possessions, and joined the new and little-known Society of Jesus. Religious life proved to be the right choice. Francis felt drawn to spend time in seclusion and prayer, but his administrative talents also made him a natural for other tasks. He helped in the establishment of what is now the Gregorian University in Rome...after his ordination, he served as political and spiritual adviser to the emperor. In Spain, he founded a dozen colleges.

At 55, Francis was elected head of the Jesuits. He focused on the growth ... the spiritual preparation of its new members, and spreading the faith in many parts of Europe. He was responsible for the founding of Jesuit missions in Florida, Mexico, and Peru... He died in 1572 and was canonized 100 years later.

Reflection

Sometimes the Lord reveals his will for us in stages. Many people hear a call in later life to serve in a different capacity. We never know what the Lord has in store for us.

First, the outer crest shape echoes the beautiful doors of our building. They are a symbol to the community of welcome, as well as protection and shelter for the children who learn safely within them. The diagonal stripes represent that our doors are open to opportunity, to the promise of the future, and to a desire for our faith to be stretched and strengthened. Traditionally, a diagonal stripe on a crest symbolizes resolve and faithfulness.

Next, the inner cross and sunburst are a visualization of the saying from our patron Saint Benedict's well-known medal "Crux Sacra Sit Mihi Lux" or "The Holy Cross Be My Light". In all things, we ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten and encourage us to be more like Christ.

Last, our new logo holds fast to our parish colors of yellow, green, and white. These traditionally stand for generosity, the elevation of the mind, peace, sincerity, hope, and growth.

Together these elements present a fresh, clean visual symbol that speaks to our legacy while representing us with clarity across all the applications necessary in today's world.
