Matthew 2:1-18 tells this story: Herod was "greatly troubled" when astrologers from the east came asking the whereabouts of "the newborn king of the Jews," whose star they had seen... Herod cunningly told them to report back to him so that he could also

"do him homage." They found Jesus, offered him their gifts, and warned by an angel, avoided Herod on their way home... Herod became furious and "ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem...two years old and under." The horror of the massacre and the devastation of the mothers and fathers led Matthew to quote Jeremiah: "A voice was heard in Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children ... " (Matthew 2:18)
