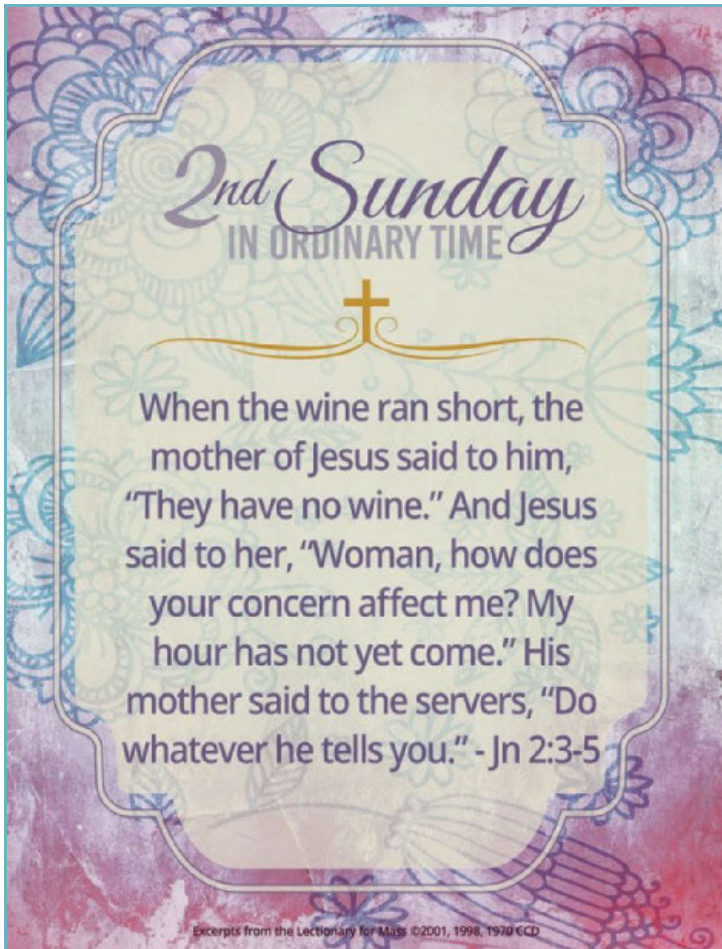

## CALL TO HOLINESS

This column is being written on the feast of St. John Neumann (Jan. 5), missionary, priest, pastor, bishop and saint. From Bohemia, Paris, New York, Kenmore, (North Bush) Williamsville and many points north, he was a missionary at heart; who gave up his family and home to plant the Gospel in Western New York. John Neumann offered up his life for our ancestors and planted the seeds of faith that still nourish us today.

Think about those individuals who have stood out in our life – who gave us direction or offered an example. It was usually because they were willing to give away a part or all of themselves. They were willing to shed more than sweat for you, putting their wants and needs on hold, facing the ridicule and storms of countless people who would jeer and laugh at them, making the testimony of love through self-giving. As St. Francis said: “Preach the Gospel always and when absolutely necessary—use words.” The follower of Christ can do nothing other than that of the Master; who most perfectly gives himself fully, so that we will find the way to the Father. Let us begin with St. John Neumann, St. Claire, The Little Flower, St. Mother Theresa, Dorothy Day, St. Maximillian Kolbe, St. Faustina, or Venerable Nelson Baker and know that when we are no longer afraid to lose ourselves – die to self – we will bring about the renewal that we need for today and the future.

## HEALTH & WELLNESS CORNER Q & A: COVID 19 BOOSTER SHOTS

Who should get a Booster?

- If original shot was a Moderna vaccine:
  - 18 or older and 6 months from last shot.
- If it was a Pfizer vaccine
  - 16 or older and 6 months from last shot.
- If a Johnson & Johnson vaccine:
  - 18 or older, 2 months after the 1st shot.

Can you get a different vaccine than your Original one – a "Mix and Match"?

For people who received Moderna or Pfizer:  
-It is preferred to receive the same brand for the booster. But getting another brand is ok. Same with Johnson & Johnson but medical evidence suggests that J & J patients who get a Pfizer or Moderna booster, may have longer lasting and more robust immunity.

## SAINT OF THE DAY

### St. Agnes, January 21

Almost nothing is known of this saint except that she was very young—12 or 13—when she was martyred in the last half of the third century... Legend has it that Agnes was a beautiful girl whom many young men wanted to marry. Among those she refused, one reported her to the authorities for being a Christian. She was arrested and confined to a house of prostitution. The legend continues that a man who looked upon her lustfully lost his sight and had it restored by her prayer. Agnes was condemned, executed, and buried near Rome in a catacomb that eventually was named after her. The daughter of Constantine built a basilica in her honor.

**Reflection:** Like that of Maria Goretti in the 20th century, the martyrdom of a virginal young girl made a deep impression on a society enslaved to a materialistic outlook. Also like Agatha, who died in similar circumstances, Agnes is a symbol that holiness does not depend on length of years, experience, or human effort. It is a gift God offers to all.

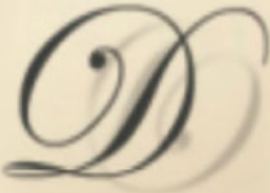
