
THE WISDOM OF FULTON SHEEN



Saint of the Week

Not many saints can be relatable to our times, but St. Thomas Becket (December 21, 1118 – December 29, 1170) is one of the few. King Henry II, a good friend, made him chancellor of England at the age of 36. Then, despite St. Thomas Becket warning the king that he would not blindly follow his wishes, he was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162.

Soon after, King Henry insisted upon seizing Church rights. In the name of peace, St. Thomas Becket came close to a compromise, and momentarily approved the Constitutions of Clarendon, which would have denied the clergy the right of trial by a Church court. But he later rejected this, and for his safety fled to France where he remained in exile for seven years.

Although returning to England meant almost certain death, St. Thomas Becket came back. According to historical accounts, King Henry implored, "Who will free me from this troublesome priest!" St. Thomas Becket was later murdered by four knights in his Canterbury Cathedral as he was praying. For his part in the murder, King Henry performed public penance after St. Thomas Becket's canonization.



The Veil Removed

In 2019, The Pew Research Center found that only 31% of self-proclaimed US Catholics believe that during Mass, the bread and wine actually become the Body and Blood of Christ. If true, this indicates the vast majority of people in the pews DO NOT understand what takes place at the altar during Mass. As a way to start this conversation in our hearts and within our families, at all Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses (except Midnight) we present a short seven-minute video entitled "The Veil Removed" for your viewing. This video is a representation of the invisible reality taking place at the altar each and every time we come to Mass. For you to better understand the teaching on the Eucharist, we will offer some opportunities for you over Lent. Please save the dates for our Parish Mission "Body of Christ Save Me: Developing a Daily Eucharistic Spirituality," taking place here April 4, 5 and 6. Our Mission Facilitator will be Dr. Eric Mabry, Assistant Professor of Philosophy & Systematic Theology at St. Mary's Seminary & University in Baltimore, MD. This is where the Diocese of Buffalo sends our Seminarians. We will share more information as we draw closer to Lent.
