



Saint of the Week

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...

My Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord and the end of the Christmas Season. It is an appropriate time to take a look at our understanding of our Baptism. Of course, Jesus went to John to be baptized. John was baptizing in the spirit of repentance and preparation for the Messiah. Jesus needed no repentance, but saw this as the moment to begin his public ministry. We are Baptized in the power of the Holy Spirit which is the Baptism that John spoke of when he said "I baptize you with water, one mightier than I will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In the early Church the Baptism of the Lord was an extremely important celebration. It ranked even higher than Christmas itself. The early Church celebrated three feasts of Light (Epiphany, the Wedding Feast of Cana and The Baptism of Jesus) that illuminated God's nature and our call to be His people. Today, I do not think we place enough emphasis on Jesus' Baptism and, I dare say, we do not really place enough emphasis on our own Baptism. Today, we see fewer families bringing their children for Baptism and we see more and more grandparents lament over that reality. For many, Baptism, I fear, has been reduced to nothing more than a custom or family tradition. We have forgotten that when we are born, we are born in a state separated from God. In Baptism we are brought to be a member of the Body of Christ and are intimately united to Jesus' Death and Resurrection. Baptism calls us to live the Faith as the very foundation of who we are as a person. Baptism is the pool from which we derive our existence, knowledge and compelling motivation to give our lives to the mission of the Cross today. We are to transmit our Faith in every aspect of our lives. For those of us who are older, we are to also pass on our Faith to the next generation. This is especially true for parents. On the day of Baptism, parents are instructed that they are accepting the responsibility of teaching the Faith to their children; to love God and neighbor as Christ Jesus taught us. A Baptism of an infant does not take place unless the parents acknowledge that they know what they are undertaking and intend to fulfill it.

I sometimes wonder if we truly appreciate and live the meaning of Baptism. I have had many conversations with current military personnel and many veterans who live with a similar fear that many in our nation do not understand each citizen's responsibility to our country. Some in political leadership also have these concerns. Our civic understanding has shifted to entitlement rather than the mission to contribute. Similarly, many in the "not for profit" sector share the concern that many in our culture today do not share the mission of their work with the poor, missionary work, or preservation of culture, arts and more. In our Church we also have to question the level of life-long commitment to mission. We continually pray for Vocations to the Priesthood, Religious Life and Consecrated Life because we see a sharp decline in the number of men and women willing to dedicate their entire life to the Life and Mission of the Gospel. A substantial part of the reason for the "Road to Renewal" is the declining number of priests. We expect just short of one hundred priests serving in the Diocese of Buffalo by the year 2030.

This Sunday may be a good time to once again go "back to basics" and ask ourselves a few questions. For those of us who are adults or teens, we need to ask the question; What does it mean to go back to the basics and do we take responsibility to help our younger children begin to ponder this in their lives as well? What do you see as the mission of your life? How many facets does that mission possess? Do you live your life motivated by the Mission of Jesus Christ rooted in Baptism, or is that not really a conscious thought?

Our parish is no different from any other parish in our Diocese and country. We have the average three-to-seven percent who enthusiastically embrace the mission of the parish and make everything happen. You know very well that we no longer have the 4:30 pm Sunday Mass because we lacked Ushers, Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors. It was not an issue of too few priests. We are blessed to have four priests serving at St. Greg's. This Christmas we were challenged with the same issue of too few Ushers and Liturgical Ministers. Again, this is not just a St. Greg's problem, but an issue facing pretty much every parish in the Diocese.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE CONTINUED. . .

We often mistakenly call those who serve in various capacities in the parish "volunteers." We often thank our "volunteers." There are no "volunteers" in the Church. Those we call "volunteers," those who are willing to roll up their sleeves daily and serve here at St. Greg's, are simply compelled to do so because they are living their Baptism and are compelled to do nothing else but live the mission. Some people sarcastically say "I'm living the dream" when asked how they are doing, when we should all honestly and energetically say daily "I'm living the Mission of Jesus Christ."

Living the Mission of Jesus is the goal of our parish, Church and very lives. Similarly, some look to the number enrolled in our Catholic Schools or Religious Education programs as indicators of discipleship. I do not look at these as signs of discipleship. Catholic schools and our Family Faith Formation programs serve to form Disciples for Christ. Rather, I look at the number of those already confirmed and those who have graduated from our Catholic schools, who are regularly at Mass and enrolled in serving in our ministries, as a good indicator of our success as a parish and Church in being and fostering intentional Disciples for Christ. How intentional are you in being His Disciple today? Intentional discipleship is the real call of our own Baptism.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you, and St. Joseph, St. Gregory the Great and Blessed Carlo Acutis intercede for you, always.

POPE FRANCIS ON THE FAMILY



"God chose a humble ...family by which to come into our midst. [Contemplate] ... the beauty of this mystery...[First] *the family is the story from which we originate*. None of us was born magically, ... Each of us has our own

[family] story. ...Jesus too is the son of a family story. ...It is beautiful to see Jesus inserted into the fabric of familial affections, which were born and grew in the caresses and concerns of his parents. [And] us as well: ...the person we are today was born not ... out of the material goods ...but... from the love in the heart of the family.

"[Second:] we learn how to be a family, each day. [We] see that even in the Holy Family things did not all go well: there were unexpected problems, anxiety, suffering. ...Mary and Joseph lose Jesus and search for Him anxiously, ...they do not understand. They need time to learn to know their son. ...Every day, families [must] learn to listen and understand one another... to face conflicts and difficulties.

And how is this done? Look to Mary, who ... says to Jesus: "Your father and I have been searching for you" (v. 48). ...It does not say, *I and your father*. Before the "I," comes "you"! Let us learn this: [To] protect harmony in the family, *the dictatorship of the "I"* [must] be fought... It is dangerous when, rather than listening to one another, we blame one another for mistakes; when... we become fixated on our own needs; when, ...we isolate ourselves with our [cell] phones. ...Let us convert ourselves from "I" to "you." ...and ...each day, let us pray ... for the gift of peace in the family. And ...commit ourselves ...to sustain, defend and safeguard the family which is our treasure!" –Angelus message, 12/26/21 (Vatican.va)
