

Inspiration for the week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...

My Dear Parish Family,

We are now in Ordinary Time. The Christmas Season came to an end last weekend with the Baptism of the Lord, and in the Bulletin last week I reflected with you about the importance of each of us living out our Baptismal promises and living as a member of the Body of Christ in the world today.

To that end, I would like to acknowledge six of our young men from St. Greg's Troop 440 who last week officially became Eagle Scouts. They include:

Alex Uzarowski, whose Eagle Scout project involved cleaning, restoring, and staining the gazebo on the grounds of Williamsville North High School.

Colin Marzec, whose Eagle project involved planting trees for *Re-Tree WNY*, an organization devoted to reforesting every public area that was destroyed by the October storm in 2006.

Ian Donnachie, whose Eagle Scout project involved building an information kiosk for Glen Park in Williams-ville. The kiosk provides information on upcoming events in the community as well as a list of plants found in the park. The project also included the removal of invasive plants and debris cleanup. It is important to note that Ian has served as a regular teen lector at St. Greg's.

Logan Marzec, whose project involved the construction of garden boxes at the *Family Help Center* in Buffalo. This Center supports children and parents in a safe and comfortable environment.

Gregory James built a "Ga-Ga" Pit for use in our Youth Ministry programs. This is a very popular game played by our youth today. It is important to note that Gregory is also a very active parishioner at St. Greg's. He is one of our Sacristans, and also has been serving our weekend Masses. He is active as a participant in our parish's AMPED ministry for young adults and he is also a core member serving the Junior High youth in our parish's EDGE program.

Jacob Balling's project involved building park benches for the Amherst State Park in Williamsville.

Congratulations to all our new Eagle Scouts. We are proud of this great accomplishment in your life, we pray you continue to serve our parish family of St. Greg's and the larger community in the name of Jesus Christ and our Church. Congratulations to their parents and to all our Scout leaders here at St. Greg's Troop 440. Thank you for your contribution in forming these fine young men.

Ordinary Time is really not ordinary. Ordinary time calls us to reflect on the three years of Jesus' ministry. We hear His teaching, witness His miracles, participate in His life of prayer and are encouraged by His challenging of others to change and be open to the truth of the Gospel. Jesus was not "ordinary" in any way. He was divine and extraordinary. We are also called to be "extraordinary" people in our "ordinary" lives as we bring the life of Christ alive within our own. It is not that hard to accomplish. If you do not believe me, please re-read the accomplishments of our six new Eagle Scouts and see that they have accomplished some extraordinary things as teenagers. We are all called to do the same.

I think last Sunday's reflection on our Baptism and our beginning of Ordinary Time calls us to reflect on the distinction between believing in Jesus versus belonging to Jesus. It is very easy to say that we are Baptized and that we believe in Jesus, but to what extent do we belong to Him? I was watching the news on Tuesday evening and there was a segment about the bitter cold temperatures predicted for this coming weekend and its effect on those planning to go to the Bills game on Saturday. One man who was interviewed said that even if it went below zero (I do not remember the exact temperature he mentioned), nothing would keep him and many others from filling the stadium on Saturday. That man not only believes in the Buffalo Bills; he belongs to them. Nothing will keep him from supporting his team. Is that where we are in our relationship with Jesus Christ? Do we belong, or do we just say we believe? Is there anything that will keep us from belonging to Christ?

PASTOR'S MESSAGE CONTINUED. . .

Last weekend Deacon Greg in his homily made the following statement (paraphrased here): "If you are elderly or ill or very concerned about Covid19 and do not leave the house to go anywhere, please stay home and join us on livestream or YouTube to pray with us for Mass. However, if you're going to the grocery store, to work or school or to the Bills game or restaurants and more, then you also need to be back here at St. Greg's in person in prayer with us. We need you." I applaud this statement. Has the convenience of worshipping at home on-line kept us from belonging to Christ and our parish family? Has wearing a mask kept you from receiving the Eucharist? We have had people come to Mass and refuse to wear a mask and when asked to put one on chose to leave rather than wear a mask and pray with us and belong to Jesus in receiving the Eucharist. At times some may let political ideology, popular thought or personal opinion outweigh belonging to Jesus. Perhaps the best way to be extraordinary in this ordinary world is to belong to Christ in every facet of our lives. Something to think about as we begin Ordinary Time.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you, and St. Joseph, St. Gregory the Great and Blessed Carlo Acutis intercede for you, always.






Does This Sit Well with You?

Q. After receiving Holy Communion, which is more appropriate, sitting or kneeling?

A. Because Holy Communion is such a sacred encounter with our Living God, may I suggest we enter our prayer after Communion with the most reverent posture possible. There is a document the Church turns to that explains the liturgical norms of the Mass called the "General Instruction of the Roman Missal." Article #43 of that Instruction states: "... if appropriate, you may sit or kneel during the period of sacred silence after Communion." So, it looks like we have the option.

Above all, strive to tune everything else out and enter into deep prayer with God. If you do that, you can be sure that your Communion will be fruitful.


