MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR . . .

My Dear Parish Family,

This weekend we mark Memorial Day. Over the last several years it seems that a few times a month we have a funeral for one of our veterans, especially those who served in World War II. There are very few of our World War II veterans still with us. Of course, Memorial Day is really the day we remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice of their lives for our country and were never able to return home but died in service. As we celebrate this weekend, please offer a prayer and spend some time reflecting upon what these brave men and women have done for us.

This weekend also offers one of those moments to focus on what we truly stand for as a nation. What are our national goals and values? Perhaps this year more than any other year, as we see the divide growing in our nation, we need to focus our national goals and values. I have often heard veterans sadly say, "This isn't what I risked my life for," when they look and see how the values of their era are being replaced with different ways of thinking and living.

I remember concelebrating a funeral for a Veteran and the priest who presided and gave the eulogy for the 93year-old gentleman made an interesting observation. He stated that the gentleman did not have an identity crisis. He knew who he was as a man of faith and as a member of the community. He knew his role as husband, father and doctor. He went on to state that he had the same traditional Catholic values and morals all his life. They did not change. The priest then posed the question, "Are some of our personal identity questions/issues today the result of a loss of values and morals?" His observation was that we never really hear about the "older" generation in their 80's and 90's suffering from an identity crisis or wondering "who they are?" It simply was not part of their lived experience. As you may recall, on several occasions, I have written articles in the Bulletin about the greatest generation of our nation. Many parishioners, at that time, commented on the accuracy of what I observed and wrote in those article. This great generation knew their identity and made awesome contributions! Perhaps we can also take a little time to reflect on what made these individuals the great men and women that they were and are and were. I believe my brother priest made a great point in his homily when referencing that some of our identity issues we face today are because we have forgotten who we are. As a nation, maybe we have forgotten the real meaning of freedom. We are often reminded, "Freedom isn't free!" Freedom does not mean that we can each do whatever we want. That is reckless freedom at best. As a people of faith, have we also forgotten who we are as the "Body of Christ?" Freedom won on the Cross with the blood of Jesus Christ isn't really free if we truly believe and desire to live as a member of His Body in the world today. The freedom to live as a son or daughter of Christ means that we are bound to each other and have duties and responsibilities to our Church, world and personally to one another.

This Memorial Day, as we particularly pray for and remember all those who have died serving our nation, it is my hope that every day we also pray in thanksgiving for all those who have served in the various branches of the military and pray for the safety of those who currently serve.

As we get ready to celebrate Pentecost next weekend, we can reflect if we live a life guided by the Holy Spirit rooted in the Word of God or if we have some other foundation for our lives? At times I have suggested that we may suffer from amnesia. We have forgotten who we are, meaning members of the Body of Christ guided by the power of the Holy Spirit. Maybe we have amnesia as a nation as well. We say we are "one nation under God," but really are we, or do we have amnesia as a nation as well. As a member of the Body of Christ we must live the Truth of Jesus' teaching. Either Jesus' Word is "the way, the truth and the life" or it isn't. Jesus didn't say that there are many truths and you can pick which one you like, nor did He say that it is ok to say I will live this as my truth but you can pick whatever truth you would like to believe. Jesus was clear to state that He is THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE. Maybe we face the many divisions we face in our life and in our country because we have amnesia and have forgotten who we are as a member of the Body of Christ and as one nation under God. Simply, we have forgotten the truth and in so do-ing we have lost our way.

In addition to our preparation for Pentecost I urge you to pray for Deacon Joe Tokasz, who will be Ordained this coming Saturday, June 4, at St. Joseph's Cathedral. I urge you to please join "Father Joe" on Sunday, June 5th at 12:30 Mass here at St. Greg's to congratulate him on his Ordination and to ask the Holy Spirit to guide and direct him in his priestly life. Please come and celebrate with him at Mass and at the parish reception to follow.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you, and St. Gregory the Great, St. Joseph and Blessed Carlo Acutis intercede for you, always.

ON OLD AGE

Pope Francis continues his catechesis on the beauty of old age (General Audience, 5/11/22):

"For many people, the prospect of retirement ...can be a source for worry... 'What will I do, now that

my life will be emptied of what filled it for so long?' Certainly, there is the joyful and tiring task of looking after grandchildren ...For grandparents, [this is] an important part of their vocation... [In the Bible,] Judith..., as an old woman, ...was able to live *a season of fullness and serenity*... It was time for her to leave for her family and her community: ...*a legacy of goodness and not only of goods*. [It is] the *goodness* that is done in old age, ...that is the best legacy we can leave.

"When we are old, we lose some of our sight, but our inner gaze becomes more penetrating — one sees with the heart. We become capable of seeing things that had previously escaped us. ... it is true: the Lord does not entrust his talents only to the young and the strong. He has talents for everyone, made to fit each person, the elderly too. The life of our communities must know how to benefit from the talents and charisms of so many elderly people who are already retired, but who are a wealth to be treasured. On the part of the elderly themselves, this requires a creative attention, ... a generous availability. The previous skills of active life ... become resources to be given away: teaching, advising, building, caring, listening ... preferably in favor of the most disadvantaged ... or who are abandoned in their loneliness. Judith is not a pensioner who lives her emptiness in melancholy. She is a passionate elderly woman who fills the time God gives her with gifts. [Read] the Book of Judith... this is how I would like all our grandmothers to be: courageous, wise, and who bequeath to us not money, but the legacy of wisdom, sown in their grandchildren."
