

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's gospel, Jesus talks about the end times, when the sun will be darkened and the moon become as red as blood and the stars will fall from the heavens. They will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds and He will gather his elect. He says that this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Yet in the Greek understanding, a generation was about forty years. These things didn't happen within forty years so what did Jesus mean? Well, according to Revelation scholar Michael Barber, Jesus meant the beginning of the end of the world. The Jerusalem temple was destroyed within forty years after Jesus' death in 70 A.D. According to Barber, the temple symbolized the world to the Jews. It had banners with the stars inscribed on them and they symbolized the heavens, it had pools that symbolized the seas, and the temple itself symbolized the world. The temple was everything to the Jews so its destruction was horrific. Yet, when will the end happen? Well Jesus says that no one will know when the Son will come again but the Father and that it will happen as fast as lightning falls from the sky. I think He meant this in His human nature because Jesus in His divine nature has infinite wisdom and knows all things. Yet, we have to always be ready. It could come in a million years but it could also come tomorrow. Even if it does not come in our lifetime, our death could come tomorrow so we always have to be ready.

Life Long Faith Formation

We celebrate the Feast of Christ the King on November 21, 2021. This day was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. He did so to remind the people of Christ's everlasting authority over the people of the earth, thereby signaling the church's resistance to the rising tide of secular values and ideas in politics as well as social matters. In 1970 the Roman Catholic Church moved the feast to the last Sunday before ADVENT begins.

Sin on the Soul Ouestion:

Why do some sacraments leave a character or mark on the soul? Don't all sacraments affect the soul?

Answer:

All sacraments mediate grace and connect us to Christ and to the Church. Some sustain us in our faith journey, while others help us heal from the effects of sin. Each one offers a share in God's life, giving us what we need to be faithful followers of Jesus. But some sacraments change us in ways that are irreversible. The three sacraments that leave a character are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. We are literally different people because of the effect of the grace of those sacraments. We are changed at the core of our being in such a fundamental way that we can not go back to what we once were.

In Baptism, we are freed from original sin, initiated into the Body of Christ as adopted sons and daughters. In Confirmation, we are given the fullness of God's Spirit, sealed in his grace and gifted with what we need to live a Christian life. In Holy Orders, a priest is marked as an 'alter Christus,' another Christ, and is once and forever a priest who offers sacrifice, forgives sin, and acts in the person of Christ. In these three sacraments, we are conformed more closely to Christ, reflecting his love and truth. ©LPi
