

Third Sunday of Advent

Gospel values are not always reflected in society's values and they are not the values promoted by Capitalism. In fact, Gospel values sound a lot like Socialism. The goal is not to acquire as much as you can but only what you need. If you have an abundance, share with those who have less. Even if you do not have much, share what little you have. Be aware of the needs of others and offer concrete help whenever you can. Don't treat some people better than others or take it upon yourself to determine who is "worthy" and who is not. Do what is best for the community rather that seek what you desire for yourself. What values do your choices reflect? What values do you want our government to support?

THIRD Week of Advent our focus is "Joy" Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice (Philippians 4:4) Traditionally, this Sunday was known as "Gaudete Sunday". We light the pink candle on our Advent Wreath to highlight the joyful mood that is elicited by our growing awareness that the Lord is near. We are called to seek solitude and quiet remembering again the few things of life that are essential, and to find ways to enrich our world around us. Whatever our inconveniences may be, each of us needs ways to avoid grumbling about them. Perhaps we can take a deep breath, smile and say or sing the psalm from today's scripture: "My soul rejoices in my God". Like Mary, we do not rejoice in ourselves or our possessions, but "our spirits rejoice in God our savior", the son of God who alone can bring true "joy to the world".

<u>Advent</u>

It is the Third Sunday of Advent and we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin. We are excited to commemorate the birth of Christ and also to anticipate his return.

In today's gospel, what stood out to me was when John said that he was baptizing with water but one mightier that he would be coming and that He would baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire. John was talking about the baptism of Jesus death on the cross rather than His baptism at the Jordan. By His death Jesus wants to set the world on fire with His love and with the Holy Spirit. Why does John the Baptist use the word fire? I believe he chose the word fire because it radically shows the power of God's love which is a love beond imagining. After Jesus death for us, he sends the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire
