

#### Baptism of the Lord

In today's gospel Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist and yet Jesus doesn't really need to be baptized because He is without sin. So why does He submit to

baptism? He submits our of obedience to the Father as an example for us of the importance of Baptism. Most of us think of Baptism I believe as a ritual that we do once, probably through our parents when we are just a baby. Yet Baptism is an ongoing commitment. We are called to continually live out our Baptism. This means we are called to remain faithful to the creed that we say every Sunday. This means that we commit ourselves to the Trinity through the Church as members of the body of Christ. We are called to be faithful to God through the Church. This means that we trust that the Church is guided by the Holy Spirit. Dogmatically, we believe that the Church cannot err. What does this mean? Well, for example, the Trinity is a dogma of the Church. So we believe that there is a Trinity, three Persons in one God, each perfect and yet different. So is we were to take a vote and the majority decided that there was not a Trinity but a quadernity, that wouldn't change the fact that there is a Trinity. It is an immutable truth that can never be compromised or changed. Another example would be that Jesus had two natures, Divine and human, but He is one person. These are truths that we accept on faith revealed to us by God through the Church. However, in disciplinary matters the Church can change in its teaching. At one time that Church believed that we should never enter a protestant church, but now they allow this. Although, we should know our faith well before opening up to ideas of other denominations. I believe we can learn for other denominations, but we need to know our faith well first. Basically, we are called to reaffirm our baptismal promises at
