Everyday Stewardship:

A Happy Ending Isn't the Whole Story

"Is there a happy ending?"

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, "Is there a happy ending?"

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-ever-after.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week — from the Passion and death of the Lord — it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear — it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.

Praise is as common to our liturgical life as petition, but we tend to overlook it. The Eucharistic prayer at the heart of the Mass is a prayer of praise and

thanksgiving, which teaches us something about the order of such prayer. Praising God is naturally followed by litanies of reasons flowing from grateful hearts. Our Responsorial Psalms, interspersed throughout the Easter vigil and sung at every Mass, dance with the opportunity to give praise to the One who keeps all promises.



- *First Eucharist families* will meet virtually on Wednesday, April 14 at 7 p.m. or on Sunday, April 18 at 2 p.m. for their final virtual preparation session. It is important that children and parents view our teaching Mass which can be found on our First Eucharist playlist prior to this session.
- *First Reconciliation:* St. Mary's fifth celebration of First Reconciliation will take place on Saturday, April 10 at 1 p.m. Our final celebration is scheduled for Monday, May 10 at 6:30 p.m.

Catholic Charities: Hope for All Seasons

In the Christian faith, Jesus is the epitome of Hope for All Seasons. His death and Resurrection showed us that after a definitive amount of time, ultimate good can be dispersed to all. Today, we rejoice in our Lord and Savior's glory!

Thank you for following the example of Catholic Charities Appeal 2021 Patron St. Ignatius Loyola, who called us to respond in faith and to find God in all things. Thank you for being attuned to God's presence in everyday circumstances as He taught us, and for responding in faith with a gift to the Appeal. With your help, Catholic charities gives Hope for All Seasons.

Beginning in 2015, The Foundation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., Inc. ("Foundation") began soliciting donations to its "Upon this Rock" ("UTR") capital and endowment campaign. The UTR campaign raised funds for many purposes, including soliciting funds for making essential upgrades to classroom facilities and technology of Christ the King Seminary ("CKS"), expanding CKS's role as a center of retreat and religious celebration, and establishing an endowment fund for CKS. Unfortunately, in early 2020, CKS's Board of Trustees determined that CKS would close at the end of the 2020-2021 academic year. CKS's closure will make it impossible for the Foundation to use the UTR funds raised for CKS for their original intended purposes. However, under New York law, when the original purposes for which funds are donated become impossible to achieve, those purposes can be modified in a manner consistent with original intent by the New York State courts. For many years, CKS provided education and formation for ordained and lay ecclesial ministers in the Diocese of Buffalo and beyond. Accordingly, the Foundation has asked the New York State Supreme Court


