Marriage: Parishioners only may be married here, and must be active parishioners for 9 months prior to scheduling a wedding. Contact the parish priest at least 6 months prior to the ceremony to make arrangements. Weddings are celebrated on Friday evenings; Saturdays at 12 noon & 2:30 p.m.

Ministry to the Sick & Homebound: Call the parish office to make arrangements for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick or to have Holy Communion brought to the home. Please notify the office of sick parishioners who are in the hospital.

RCIA: This process is designed for adults who are: 1) interested in be coming a Catholic; or 2) are baptized Catholics wishing to complete their initiation process by receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist. Interested individuals should contact the parish office.

Letters of Recommendation: A Letter of Recommendation to serve as a sponsor for the Sacrament of Baptism and/or

serve as a sponsor for the Sacrament of Baptism and/or Confirmation can be given only to registered members of the parish who are confirmed, attend Mass and receive the sacraments regularly. If the requesting person is married, the marriage must have taken place in conformity with the laws of the Church.

An extract from the "St. Paul's Roman Catholic Church: Centennial of Faith and Service"

Father Leonard was determined to undertake a house-to house collection to raise money to pay off the loans. The Mangs and the Kellers, however, were not in favor of this plan, which troubled the Pastor, until he was told that they preferred instead to simply cancel the debt. Father Leonard was, of course, surprised, and grateful. This is just another example of the generosity of our founding families.

Relieved of this financial burden, Fathers Leonard and Pfeil could turn their attention to other work, such as bringing running water to the church and school. All the water used for these buildings had to be brought by buckets from a pump located through the adjacent field, quite a distance away. Fetching water was most often the responsibility of the school children.

Over the last several weeks you should have seen and taken information on the Road to Renewal. Now we would like to tell you who are family is and a few things we will be doing to start the slow process. First we are family number 17 and our family includes the following parishes. St. Paul's, St. Andrew, Blessed Sacrament, St. Timothy, St. John the Baptist & St. Stephen's on Grand Island. We are not a pilot parish and we are in Phase 3 of the process. We are looking at 2024 as the year we should be working as a family. With guidance we will start sharing and working with our family in areas of sacrament preparation, Faith Formation and possibly staffing. As we start collaborating a notice will be put out to keep all parishioners updated as to the progress.



Also available will be forms for your health records for you to take home and fill out so in case anything should arise, your family/caretaker will have the information needed to make accurate decisions for your care.





INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love.
