
SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Engaged couples are to make wedding arrangements at least eight months in advance. Pre-Cana classes are required.

Grace and Peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ...



"And they opened their treasures and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh". The magi arrive in Bethlehem desiring to find the "newborn king of the Jews" who has been revealed to them by the light of a star.

In their search for the newborn king of the Jews, the magi travel first to the place where one could expect to find a royal child – the royal city of Jerusalem. But they do not find Jesus among the wealthy, powerful and elite. Instead, they are sent by the chief priests and scribes to Bethlehem, a small town that is a fitting birthplace for one who will use his authority to "shepherd" his people rather than rule over them with military power and coercive control.

On the final Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate Jesus as the "King of the Universe." With that title we find a truth proclaimed about the Lord: He is powerful and mighty, deserving of all honor and praise. As Christians, however, we must always hold this identity of Jesus with the equally true revelation of Him as a helpless and humble child born far from the luxury and protection of a royal household. God did not choose for His son to be raised with ease and privilege, and as an adult Jesus did not perform miracles to impress or to exert power over others.

In Jesus we find a marriage of total power with complete humility and vulnerability. The epiphany is a revelation of the person of Christ and a revelation of what we are called to be as Christians. The magi, who are well known, respected, and revered in their own country, come to Bethlehem to kneel at the feet of a peasant child whom they recognize as a king, greater than any they have ever known. May we also find Jesus and be ready to serve Him for the weak and the poor, for in our humility we become like Christ, the shepherd king. In seminary formation, we call our candidates to priesthood to be servant leaders of God's people. Following our Lord, Jesus Christ, they are ready and willing to grab a pitcher, towel and bowl and begin washing the dirty and bloody feet of his disciples.

The magi upon encountering Jesus with His mother, Mary, are not content to only fall down in worship; they also desire to offer something tangible to the child. From their treasures they present Him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. In our own unique ways, we too have encountered the child of Bethlehem. We find him in the faces of those we hold dear, within the bread and wine of the Eucharist, and within our very hearts. In what ways might we respond, both in homage and through gifts, to the revelation of Christ within our midst?

Wise men (individuals) still follow him....

Let us pray...

Jesus, as you led the Three Kings to you by the light of a star, please draw us ever closer to You by the light of Faith. Help us to desire you as ardently as they did. Give us the grace to overcome all the obstacles that keep us far from you. May we, like them, have something to give you when we appear before You. Amen

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying,

"Where is the newborn king of the Jews?

We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

*And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;
since from you shall come a ruler,
who is to shepherd my people Israel."*

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance.

He sent them to Bethlehem and said,
"Go and search diligently for the child.

When you have found him, bring me word,
that I too may go and do him homage."

After their audience with the king they set out.
