**BAPTISMS:** Congratulations! A new child is a blessing! Parents, please call the office four months prior to the anticipated birth of the child to schedule a Baptismal class to learn more about this most important sacrament. As you prepare to have your child baptized, begin to pray about who would be good and holy Godparents to help your child grow in the faith. A Godparent in the Catholic tradition is someone who participates at Liturgy regularly, has been Confirmed, and lives a life in accord with the Catholic Church. All prospective Godparents must receive a letter of approval from their pastor.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:** Is the Holy Spirit calling you to become Catholic? Call the Parish Office for more information.

**CARE OF THE SICK:** Anyone seriously ill or entering the hospital in anticipation of surgery may receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements.

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** Best wishes! Couples seeking a Catholic marriage, please contact the Pastor at least six months prior to a planned wedding day. Attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) is required.

**EUCCHARIST TO THE SICK AND SHUT-INS:** If ill or shut-in, please call the parish office if you wish that the Blessed Sacrament be brought to you.

**JOINING OUR PARISH:** New members and families are warmly welcomed. Contact the parish office to register, and please introduce yourself to the pastor when you join us for Liturgy. Know that you are always welcome and we are blessed to have your presence.

**LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:** One of the great ways to live out our call as disciples is to help others grow in the faith. Being asked to serve as a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation is a great honor and responsibility. As we raise our children in the tradition of the Church, it is our duty to set a good example for them. Prospective Godparents and Sponsors are to be individuals who regularly participates at Liturgy and have been Confirmed. For those who are married, their marriage must be validly recognized by the Catholic Church. For those who have children, their children must be enrolled in Faith Formation at St. Pius X Parish. ## Grace and Peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ...

"The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life."



Over the past several weeks, has we have journeyed through chapter 6 of John's gospel. We have encountered Jesus who can relieve physical hunger with the feeding of the five thousand and a source of nourishment necessary for fullness of life. Today's gospel and first reading call us to make a choice, just as the people of Israel did when Joshua, shortly before his death, gathered them together for an invitation to rededicate themselves to serving the Lord. This choice is also placed before the Twelve when Jesus asks them, "Do you also want to leave?"

A life of discipleship is not easy. We are called to accept teachings that are difficult and commandments that, at times, seem impossible. Jesus asks us to love our enemies, turn the other cheek, and embrace the same vulnerability and humility that he embodies on the cross. To any one of these requests we might be tempted to say, "This is hard, who can accept it?" Jesus reminds us today that these words, which cause consternation and challenge us to be more than we ever thought possible, are "Spirit and life."

Peter's response is one of perfect faith to Jesus' question, "Do you also want to leave?" Theologian Roman Guardini writes in his book *The Lord*, "Peter does not say": We understand what you mean, but: We hold fast to your hand. Your words are words of life, whether we understand them or not." Each day, as disciples of Jesus, we are given a choice: "Do you also want to leave?" May our response be that of Peter's and the Israelites' who proclaim with certainty, "We will serve the Lord, for He is our God."

It is not easy to follow the Lord today especially in the midst of our diocese's sexual abuse situation and bankruptcy and its reconfiguration and our prolonged struggle with the pandemic. We are not what we used to be in number, commitment or source of refuge and hope. Yet, we need to ask ourselves this question, "Do you want to leave." I hope and pray that the answer is to remain firm in our belief and trust in the Lord. Yes, these are difficult times, change is difficult, yet we too must accept the challenge to live the gospel and be a light of hope to others. This weekend we welcome Bishop Michael as we celebrate our feast day of St. Pius X. Hopefully his words will help us recommit our efforts to our mission of discipleship. I ask for your continued prayers as we strive to respond to the invitation to follow the Lord even in these difficult times.

As we seek co-responsibility in collaboration by creating a Parish Pastoral Council to assist us in discerning our path forward, one thing I know, is that we need the "Spirit and life" of Christ to direct our efforts towards that goal. We need to keep our eyes on Christ as we strive to fulfill our call to

discipleship. St. Pius' motto is "Restore all things in Christ." Let us keep one another in our prayers on this sojourn of being faithful to our call yet open to where that call could be leading us deeper in that mission of Christ.

## FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

The Finance Council (Fr. Robert Wozniak, Trustees John Philipps and James Trimper Sr., Len Fiegl, Norm Kosmerl, Jim McGraw, Jude Schwendler) met August 10th to review the fiscal status of our parish. As of June 30th, our finances – receipts and expenses as well as Sunday and Holyday collections-- were on budget as planned for 2021. However, collections were down year-over-year and continue a 10- year downward trend.

The Council approved an alarm system for the Father Weber Center, a new roof on the garage next to the rectory and landscaping improvements. Also discussed was a "Parish Wish List" which included a new floor for the Father Weber Center, accessible bathrooms for the disabled in the church and the Father Weber Center, shelving in the rectory basement and renovations to the confessionals. These projects will begin reconsidered and evaluated as finances permit.

The Steering Committee discussed current culture, pre-Covid culture and the future vision of this Parish. All members concurred we have a strong, solid foundation and our ministries are ready to reactivate. The group agreed we need leaders to step forward in numerous positions and welcoming our parishioners back and encouraging them to re-join our parish life. All agreed that we need to strengthen our role in the community as well as parish life in order to become recognized as a faith community that people will want to join. The next meeting will focus on discerning "What a Parish Pastoral Council is and how a council is organized and functions." You may review the detailed minutes from Steering Committee on the bulletin boards each entrance of the Church.

## HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE HOMEBOUND

Since the earliest days of our Church, a great corporal work of mercy has been to visit those who are sick. This can be a graced moment for those whose injury or illness might prevent them from joining our community for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in person, and it is a great act of charity to bring the Eucharist to those who pray with us from a distance. Because the liturgy is a prayer not celebrated by one person but by a community, it is most appropriate to remember as a community those who cannot join us physically. For all who take Holy Communion to the home-bound, we ask you to place your open pyx on the credence table in the sanctuary along with a note of how many Hosts you will need. Then, following the reception of Holy Communion, we will call you forward to receive the pyx before praying over you as a community so you can immediately take the Blessed Sacrament to the ill members of our community.

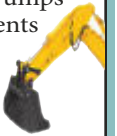
