**BAPTISMS:** Congratulations! A new child is a blessing! Parents, please call the office four months prior to the anticipated birth of the child to schedule a Baptismal class to learn more about this most important sacrament. As you prepare to have your child baptized, begin to pray about who would be good and holy Godparents to help your child grow in the faith. A Godparent in the Catholic tradition is someone who participates at Liturgy regularly, has been Confirmed, and lives a life in accord with the Catholic Church. All prospective Godparents must receive a letter of approval from their pastor.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:** Is the Holy Spirit calling you to become Catholic? Call the Parish Office for more information.

**CARE OF THE SICK:** Anyone seriously ill or entering the hospital in anticipation of surgery may receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements.

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** Best wishes! Couples seeking a Catholic marriage, please contact the Pastor at least six months prior to a planned wedding day. Attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) is required.

**EUCCHARIST TO THE SICK AND SHUT-INS:** If ill or shut-in, please call the parish office if you wish that the Blessed Sacrament be brought to you.

**JOINING OUR PARISH:** New members and families are warmly welcomed. Contact the parish office to register, and please introduce yourself to the pastor when you join us for Liturgy. Know that you are always welcome and we are blessed to have your presence.

**LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:** One of the great ways to live out our call as disciples is to help others grow in the faith. Being asked to serve as a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation is a great honor and responsibility. As we raise our children in the tradition of the Church, it is our duty to set a good example for them. Prospective Godparents and Sponsors are to be individuals who regularly participates at Liturgy and have been Confirmed. For those who are married, their marriage must be validly recognized by the Catholic Church. For those who have children, their children must be enrolled in Faith Formation at St. Pius X Parish. ## Grace and Peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ...

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me."



We hear today in scripture that Jesus asks His disciples a deeply personal question: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answers for the group by proclaiming, "You are the Christ." Peter and the other disciples began this journey as ordinary men who were called from their everyday labors to follow an itinerant preacher. During their time with Jesus, they have sat at His feet as He proclaimed the good news that the kingdom of God has drawn near, watched as He healed those who were ill, and witnessed Him casting out demons. Their discipleship is based not on a printed set of beliefs but on a relationship with the Lord.

This is true for each of us as well. Christianity is not about following doctrine or adhering to a certain set of rules. Instead, it is a covenant relationship with the Lord of Life. Throughout our lives of discipleship, our answer to this question "Who do you say that I am?" will change. At times we might know Jesus as the one who performs wonders in our lives, or perhaps as the great teacher whose words bring us wisdom. At other times, Jesus will be the comforter who walks with us in times of grief, or perhaps as the just judge who calls us to repentance and growth.

This question "Who do you say that I am?" is found in each of the synoptic gospels. We celebrate Peter's first confession of faith that this He is "the Christ" even as we ourselves confront this question today. We live a communal faith that is also deeply personal. Each one of us must answer for ourselves, who do we say Jesus is and how do we live out this belief every moment of our lives?

As we remember the Twentieth Anniversary of 9/11 this weekend, we pause to pray for the victims who lost their lives, their family members who still live with the horror of that moment and for those who protect us daily from being in harms way. We entrust them to Jesus, who is the one who can heal, strengthen and provide the necessary grace for us to overcome such an injustice upon humanity. Lord, we ask you to hear our prayers, strengthen our belief and never allow us to forget your presence in this moment and every moment of our lives. It is you we seek, to walk with us through these difficult moments toward that hope which is eternal. We will never forget...

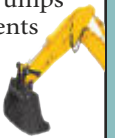
