**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** Best wishes! Couples seeking a Catholic marriage, please contact the Pastor at least six months prior to a planned wedding day. Attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) is required.

**EUCCHARIST TO THE SICK AND SHUT-INS:** If ill or shut-in, please call the parish office if you wish that the Blessed Sacrament be brought to you.

**JOINING OUR PARISH:** New members and families are warmly welcomed. Contact the parish office to register, and please introduce yourself to the pastor when you join us for Liturgy. Know that you are always welcome and we are blessed to have your presence.

## Grace and Peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ...

The Church today is witnessing a series of very painful scandals. Most devastating among these, of course, is the abuse of children. It is urgent that the Church address this scandal by attending those victimized and set in place new policies from the highest levels of Church leadership to the local Diocese. This is beside the other four knots that cause other scandals that were articulated in the Road to Renewal in the Diocese of Buffalo.



In today's gospel passage, there's some of Jesus' strongest language about anyone who sins or causes others to sin. It comes in the teaching part of Mark's Gospel which we are hearing the last four Sundays. One of my favorite commentators on Mark's Gospel, the late Fr. Eugene Lavarda, points out that Mark presents Jesus' teaching which touches upon a number of issues in His own community. Scandal must have been one of them since Jesus' strong language comes in the form of exaggerated hyperbole, an over the top figure of speech.

Jesus says if one causes another to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If our hand or foot or eye causes us to sin Jesus commands cut it off. These pretty strong responses are obviously not meant to be taken literally. They are not as Fr. Lavarda says a moral prescription rather they're intended to jolt the audience into realizing what is at stake and to change attitudes and behavior. He also says that a hyperbole about scandal is meant for the disciples particularly in the wake of their concerns about being first in the reign of God and excluding outsiders from working deeds in Jesus' name. The attitude of such leaders in the Christian community could easily lead to or tolerate scandalous behavior. So much of the gospels speak directly to our time which Fr. Lavarda concludes this leaves no doubt that scandal was a grave concern for Jesus, the early church and for Mark the Evangelist. We might add to our age as well.

Our Prayer for Renewal calls us to discern anew the pathways that will lead us closer to God. We ask God to send forth His Spirit to lead and guide our Emmaus journey as we commit ourselves to the Renewal of our Church. This is our time of purification and recommitment to once again be called back to what a Christian is to be: a light of hope as we strive to follow that call of holiness. Let's keep one another in our prayers as we strive to follow the initiative that calls for Renewal.

## **Steering Committee for Parish Pastoral Update:**

On Tuesday, September 14, the Steering Committee met to further their attention on the forming of a St. Pius X Parish Pastoral Council. In attendance were: John Philipps, James Trimper, Barb Voigt, Frank Olesko, Richard Fox, Nora Fiegl, Mondo LoVecchio, James McGraw, Arun Joseph, Laura Salgado, Madeleine Auguste and Fr. Rob. This second meeting focused primarily upon gaining wisdom and insights in regards to structure and purpose of a council. The group watched a webinar entitled; "Parish Pastoral Councils: Forming Leaders for Parishes" by Dr. Susan Timoney, STD, Catholic Apostolate Center Advisor, Associate Professor of Practice Pastoral Studies Area, Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies, and Director of the Certificate in Pastoral Ministry at The Catholic University of America's School of Theology and Religious Studies.

Dr. Timoney discussed how Parish Pastoral Councils can serve as an active opportunity for utilizing the gift of discernment to see where God is calling a community and addressed what a Pastoral Council is, how they work effectively, and why a community should use them. The original presentation was given in July of this year. Insights gained and articulated from the webinar were: The pastoral council is an important consultative body for the pastor. It should reflect the face of the parish and represent the various pastoral activities that are carried out within the boundaries of the parish. The members of the council should be representative of the parish; knowledgeable about the faith; committed to practicing and registered members of the parish; knowledgeable of various programs, apostolates and initiatives of the parish and committed to the evangelization mission of the Church.

The committee will gather again in October looking to develop a structure: including, roles, responsibilities and guidelines to present to the parish as a means to accomplish this task. The goal of the Steering Committee is to have a Parish Pastoral Council established and in place by the First Sunday of Advent. Please keep the committee in your prayers.

If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"
