ST. DOMINIC OF SILOS (DEC. 20TH)

St. Dominic of Silos (1000-1073), was born in Spain into a peasant family. As a young boy he spent time in the fields, where he welcomed the solitude. He became a Benedic-

tine priest and served in numerous leadership positions. Following a dispute with the King over property, St. Dominic and two other monks were exiled. They established a new Monastery in what at first seemed an unpromising location. Under his leadership, however, it became one of the most famous houses in Spain.


