

Part of the Christmas Octave, Holy Innocents Day is observed annually on December 28th. The day commemorates the execution of the innocent, male children in Bethlehem as told in Matthew 2:16. Known as the Feast of the Holy Innocents (or Childermas), it involves King Herod's jealousy which fulfilled the Old Testament prophecy. This day is observed in the Western churches on Dec. 28th and Eastern churches on Dec. 29th. These children are considered martyrs, or Saints of God, by the Church. The day serves as a reminder that Jesus came in difficult times for us all.

ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST (DEC. 27TH)

The Son of Zebedee, St. John ("John" from the Hebrew meaning, "Yahweh is gracious"), was among the first disciples of Jesus and perhaps the youngest. He was the only one who

did not abandon Jesus at the moment of crucifixion, remaining near the cross. Jesus entrusted His mother to him, asking him to take care of her. Toward the end of his life, he wrote his Gospel, narrating the events he had himself had witnessed. Tradition holds that he is also the author of the Book of Revelation, relating to his visions on the islands of Patmos. He is often depicted in art as a youth with an eagle and a book. He may also have a cup with a viper in it. St. John is the patron saint of booksellers, writers, and theologians. May he pray for us.


