TODAY'S GOSPEL. It's all about who Jesus is and who people believe Him to be. The story of Jesus' preaching and rejection at Nazareth is found in each of Synoptic Gos-

pels. In the Gospel of Luke, it is told near the beginning of His public ministry to foretell His passion and death, and help explain the inclusion of the Gentiles in the promise of salvation. Only St. Luke identifies the content of Jesus' teaching in any detail, with the cause of this rejection at Nazareth in the context of this later Christian history. Just as the people at Nazareth did not welcome the Good News that Jesus announced, so too many Israelites will not accept the preaching of the Gospel. Jesus persevered. So may we also live the Gospel, even if it is difficult.

ST. ANSGAR (FEB. 3RD)

St. Ansgar (801-865), became a Benedictine at Corbie, France, where he had been educated. Three years later, when the King of

Denmark became a convert, St. Ansgar went to that country for three years of missionary work, without noticeable success. Sweden asked for Christian missionaries, and he then went there, suffering capture by pirates and other hardships on the way. Fewer than two years later, he was recalled, to become abbot of New Corbie (Corvey) and bishop of Hamburg. After 13 years' work in Hamburg, he saw it burned to the ground by invading Northmen; both Sweden and Denmark returned to paganism. He directed new apostolic activities in the North, traveling to Denmark and was instrumental in the conversion of another King. By the strange device of casting lots, the King of Sweden allowed the Christian missionaries to return. Biographers remark that St. Ansgar was an extraordinary preacher, a humble and ascetical priest, and devoted to the poor. May he pray for us.


