


THE MONTH OF MARY

May is a special time for Catholics to honor our Blessed Mother Mary. During this month, both in Church and in their homes — people offer up to Mary from their heart's prayer and veneration. It is the month we honor Mary as the Mother of Jesus and our Heavenly Mother. Mary has a unique role in salvation history as the Mother of God, conceived without Sin, who by her own free will agreed to bring the "Word made flesh" (Jn 1:14), our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, into the world. The *Hail Mary* is probably the most popular prayer to Mary and has its basis in Sacred Scripture. When the Angel Gabriel was sent to Mary by the Father, he greeted her. "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" (Lk 1:28). When Mary visited Elizabeth, Elizabeth exclaimed, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Lk 1:41-42). The second part of the prayer is in response to the first, asking Mary to pray for us and addressing her as the Mother of God. Live this month well — live it for God.

Catechetical Corner a Weekly Faith Growing Bulletin Corner

ASCENSION THURSDAY

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord commemorates Jesus' Ascension into Heaven. Historically, this holy day has been celebrated 40 days after Easter Sunday – the Thursday in the sixth week of Easter. Most U.S. Dioceses, however, have moved the celebration of the Ascension to the Seventh Sunday of Easter. For this reason, it is now often referred to as "Ascension Sunday." The day of celebration – Thursday or Sunday – seems to vary from Diocese to Diocese and Country to Country in 2024. When celebrated on a Thursday, the Ascension of the Lord remains a holy day of obligation.

TRIALS HELP YOU GROW

It's easy to forget that God is always drawing us closer to Him. Many times, this requires us to endure some hardship or trial. If we can surrender those trials to His providence, then we experience grace. Father Jacques Philippe wrote in Interior Freedom about the need to maintain our peace in God. He writes, "The most important and fruitful acts of our freedom are not those by which we transform the outside world as those by which we change our inner attitude in light of the faith that God can bring good out of everything without exception." Think of the healing power of God in your life. Doesn't it amaze you how good God is? Although no one wants a crisis, God works even amid these hardships to sanctify us and allow us to know His love.

DO WHAT I COMMAND YOU. This week we hear Jesus say to the Apostles and to us, "You are my friends if you do what I command you" (Jn 15:14). In Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love and to lay down your life for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens your friendship with Him. His suffering is yours; yours is His. Become a friend of God. This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen Jesus?

ST. JOHN OF AVILA (MAY 10th)

Born of wealthy parents at Almodovar del Campo, New Castle, Spain, St. John of Avila 1499-1569), was sent to the University of Salamanca when fourteen to study law. He was attracted to the religious life instead and left to live a life of austerity. Three years

later he went to Alcala to study philosophy and was ordained. Left wealthy when his parents died, he disposed of his wealth to aid the poor. He preached all over Spain and was the spiritual adviser to St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Francis Borgia, and St. Peter of Alcantara, among others. St. John of Avila was canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1970.


