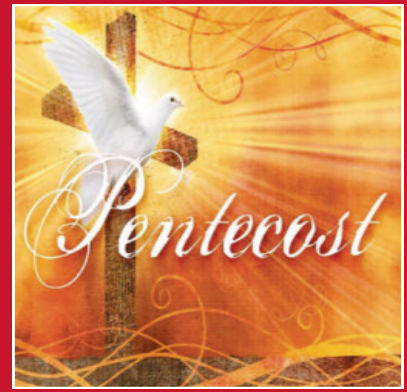

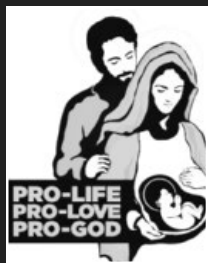

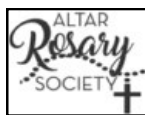

## SEE RED...LIVE PENTECOST!

Seeing red all around you at Church today? What we put on our bodies serves only as a reminder of what is really important during these liturgical celebrations. At Pentecost, it was the Spirit of God that filled those in the first Christian community. We wear red to call to mind that very Spirit, often depicted as a fire or flame. *However, if we just use red as a reminder of the power of the Spirit without letting it change us, then our actions become merely sentimental.* You are filled with the Holy Spirit through the Church’s Sacraments. God touches you and enters into you in a profound way, just like in that upper room at Pentecost. That first powerful movement of the Spirit led to a Church that grew and flourished and remains alive today. *What is the movement of the Spirit within calling you to do today? Do you allow God to move you and do great things through you? Red is a bold color to wear at any time. But let your actions be even bolder.*

### Catechetical Corner A Weekly Faith Growing Bulletin Corner

#### PENTECOST

Today we celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost is celebrated fifty days after Easter. (Pentecost literally means "fifty"). It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles following the Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ, causing them to speak in tongues. This important event in the Christian faith is described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31), the fifth book of the New Testament of the Bible. Pentecost marks the beginning of the Christian Church's mission to the world. *Think about what YOUR mission is at home, at work, and in our greater world.*



"Come, Holy Spirit...Replace the tension within us with a holy relaxation. Replace the turbulence within us with a sacred calm. Replace the anxiety within us with a quiet confidence. Replace the fear within us with a strong faith. Replace the bitterness within us with the sweetness of grace. Replace the darkness within us with a gentle light. Replace the coldness within us with a loving warmth. Replace the night within us with your light. Replace the Winter within us with your Spring. Straighten our crookedness. Fill our emptiness. Dull the edge of our pride. Sharpen the edge of our humility. Light the fires of our love. Quench the flames of our lust. Let us see ourselves as you see us that we may see You." Amen.

What makes that continuation of our Church possible over thousands of years? This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. ### ST. CHRISTOPHER MAGALLANES AND COMPANIONS (MAY 21st)

St. Christopher Magallanes (1869-1927), was born in Mexico. He worked with the poor and the indigenous people, founding schools and forming agrarian co-operatives. In the 1920's, when the anti-Catholic Mexican government closed all Seminaries, he attempted to start them but each time was forced to stop. On May 21, 1927, he was arrested on the false charge of promoting armed rebellion. Four days later he was executed along with twenty-one diocesan priests and three layman.

**Prayer:** "St. Christopher Magallanes and Companions, you chose to die rather than give in to atheistic and anti-Catholic oppression. You valued the Catholic faith over your own lives. Please pray for me, that I will have the courage you each had so that I can give witness to my love of God, even to the shedding of my blood. St. Christopher Magallanes and Companions, pray for me. 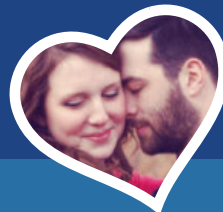
