Epiphany: A sudden manifestation, insight, revelation, or understanding

The Feast of the Epiphany is one of the most fascinating parts of the Christian narrative for a number of reasons. Put this in perspective: The Jews have waited thousands of years in their little pocket of the world for their promised Messiah. Once he finally arrives, however, the only Jewish people he is revealed to are the Holy Family and some low-rent shepherds.

Shockingly, he is then sought out by and manifested to gentiles (non-Jews). Think about that: The long-awaited Jewish savior is presented to people that aren't even Jewish. That's **HUGE!** This very act actually foreshadows Pentecost, when the apostles are told to go out to all the world to proclaim the Good News. Not just to other Jews. Not just in the confines of Judea. But to **EVERYONE** throughout the entire **WORLD**.

Obviously, God is pretty inclusive. But are we, as God's children, the same? Do we shun people that look different, talk different, or have a different belief than us? The feast of the Epiphany is a celebration that God became man to save **everyone** in the world. Everyone. We may have boarders, languages, customs, and traditions that divide us, but in the end, we're really all in it together... With each person having their own special gifts to give.

Dear Family,

Merry Christmas!! Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of our Lord. Prophecies are once again fulfilled with the arrival of people from the East, that is non-Jewish people, who have come to honor the newborn King. Last week on Christmas Day some heard the story of the angel's message to the shepherds. Isn't it interesting that the first to hear of the arrival of the Messiah were simple, uneducated shepherds and not the elite of the day? Today, however, we see the arrival of the educated. These magi were highly educated and intelligent! They were able to deduce from their reading of Scripture, even though they themselves were not Jewish, that the arrival of the Messiah would happen in their lifetime. They were able to understand that the supernatural phenomenon that we refer to as the 'star' was the sign that they were awaiting. They dropped everything, packaged up their belongings along with expensive gifts, and traveled a long distance following this star to encounter the long-awaited Savior King! When they arrived and encountered this Child, they offered their gifts and knelt in homage before Him! They recognized that the One in whose presence they were, was far greater than their own knowledge and wisdom! They were filled with great joy! They also were able to understand the battle into which they found themselves. They understood that Good and evil were at odds here. Herod was the evil darkness that was in battle against the Eternal Good, the Light that was this Child, God Himself. They chose the Good and avoided the evil Herod at the direction of the message they received in a dream. May we, all these years later, come to understand our need to kneel before the Newborn King! May we understand that we owe everything to Him. May we who just last week exchanged gifts with one another in His honor, remember to bring our gifts to Him who is the source of all gifts!

Mt 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were

overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.
