'The people were filled with expectation...' (Luke 3:15)

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord showcases the truly special nature of Jesus: Fully human, yet fully divine. On one hand, you have Jesus insisting that John baptize him (when he doesn't even need it), thus making him one of *us...* but then you have a dramatic celestial display of the heavens opening up and God speaking, thus making him one with *God.*

It's this two-fold nature of Jesus that people have struggled to understand for over 2,000 years. And as beautiful as artwork of Jesus is, it certainly doesn't help the situation. For example, should we view Jesus a sweaty

carpenter in sandals with dirty fingernails, or should we view Jesus a regal vision of glory enthroned in Heaven? Should we imagine Jesus as getting cold, hungry, and feeling emotions, or should we invision him transfigured in radiant light?

Here's the thing: Neither views are wrong, and both are actually very correct. Whether you view Jesus as the 30 year old guy going into the murky Jordan River, or whether you view Jesus as the divine Messiah with the Holy Spirit desending upon him, you're still holding your Lord in your mind and heart. That's the beauty of our faith. That's what happens when the word is made flesh and dwells among us: He can be all things to all people.

It allows us to continue our growth as Christian people. May we always be ready and eager to encounter Jesus anew as we contemplate His great love for us!
