'...and his disciples began to believe in him.'
(John 2:11)

The last line of the Gospel this weekend after Jesus performs his first miracle of turning the water into wine shows how even Jesus had to prove himself to his disciples. This wasn't a situation of Jesus saying, "Hey, guys, I'm the Messiah," with them responding, "Cool! We'll follow you anywhere!" Even the Son of God couldn't be taken at face value. There needed to be tangible evidence and proof like a miracle.

So, looking on the flipside, if Jesus had to prove to his followers that he was the Lord, how do **we** prove to Jesus that we are **his** followers? In an age of "fake news" and filtered photos,

how do we show that we are real, authentic disciples of Jesus Christ?

If we are to see Jesus in everyone we meet, let's ask ourselves some questions:

Do we bully and harass others... or do we try to build each other up? Do we talk negatively or lie about someone behind their back... or do we try to foster healthy communication? Are we unkind, unjust, cruel, mean, and un-Christian... or do we show empathy, compassion, mercy, and love?

Sadly, we don't have the power to turn water into wine. However, we do have the power to be the example of a Christian. And *that* is a miracle all to itself.

First Reading

Is 62:1-5

For Zion's sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her vindication shines forth like the dawn and her victory like a burning torch. Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory; you shall be called by a new name pronounced by the mouth of the LORD. You shall be a glorious crown in the hand of the LORD, a royal diadem held by your God. No more shall people call you "Forsaken, " or your land "Desolate," but you shall be called "My Delight," and your land "Espoused." For the LORD delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

Gospel

Jn 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.
