

#### A Message From Father Walter TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We act in another's name in many different circumstances, for example, as ambassadors, those with power of attorney, parents until a child is of legal age. When we act in another's name, we are not acting as ourselves, but as the other. We are not serving our own needs or interests, but the other's. So it is with those who act in Jesus's name.

What does it mean to act in Jesus' name? What is done in his name, even by those who seemingly are not disciples, continues his saving mission. Jesus is not concerned about who "belong" or not, but rather about whether what they do is consistent with his saving mission. Whoever places serving Jesus and his saving mission above serving their own needs and interests is a true disciple.

Faithfully acting in Jesus' name requires radical choices on our part. For example, choosing to be full, conscious, active participant in liturgy; choosing to follow Gospel values rather than merely follow the crowd; choosing to follow God's call to ordained ministry or religious life. While these and many other radical choices are never easy, when we remain focused on Jesus and his saving mission, we cooperate with him in bringing about the kingdom of God. These choices are life-giving for us and others.

#### **SPECIAL SECOND COLLECTIONS**

My Dear People,

These recent weeks have been a difficult time as many were affected by the devastating earthquake in Haiti and also Hurricane Ida in Louisiana. I sincerely thank you for your generosity in offering prayers for those impacted by these destructive events.

As we have all seen from the media coverage of these events, they have caused substantial loss of life, damage, and significant devastation in Haiti and U.S. gulf and East Coast. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops requests that we take up a collection for the humanitarian, longterm recovery, and Church needs arising from these catastrophes. The funds collected in these special appeals will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and/or Catholic Relief Services, the official relief agencies of the U/S. Catholic Church, as they and their local agencies respond to the immediate emergency needs as well as aid in long-term recovery. I ask that a second collection be taken up in all parishes in September for the needs in Haiti and another collection in October to support the Hurricane Ida recovery. We offer our prayers to families who have lost loved ones or are among those injured. As is often the case, the poor are the hardest hit by these conditions, but many will have immense unmet needs. We ask your parish community to be as generous as possible.
