



## Dear Parishioners & Friends of CTK ,

Merry Christmas to everyone whose eyes are gazing upon this humble letter. I thank God for all of you who make our parish such a vibrant place of faith, proclaimed and lived.

Christmas Night perhaps begs more questions than gives answers. We bring to this celebration our faith and one more year of life experience since last Christmas. That alone makes this particular celebration brand new. Births, deaths, life choices, growing in wisdom, we have all been changed somewhat (a little, or a lot). Each of us will have to fill in the blanks articulating those changes in our lives.

At Christmas Mass during the Night, we read from Saint Paul's Letter to Titus where he urges us to live lives of Temperance, Justice, and Devotion as we await the coming of the Lord.

"Beloved: The grace of God has appeared, saving all and training us to reject godless ways and worldly desires and to live temperately, justly, and devoutly in this age, as we await the blessed hope, the appearance of the glory of our great God and savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to deliver us from all lawlessness and to cleanse for himself a people as his own, eager to do what is good." (Titus 2, 11-14).

These are 3 really important characteristics that should challenge us all. *Temperance* is moderation in action, thought, or feeling, restraint, habitual moderation in the indulgence of the appetites or passions, self-control, sobriety. *Justice* is impartiality, reasonableness, proportionality, doing what is morally right or good. *Devotion* is a mental attitude that leads to frequent and sincere prayer and worship, the faithful performance of one's duties especially in regard to family life and faith.

Once again, this has been a challenging year for us all in dealing with pandemic limitations. But may this celebration of God's presence among us cleanse us and make us truly eager to do what is good. We are His holy people. Let us continue to Rejoice!

- ♦If you are unable to have the picture fill your screen, try using "Fire Fox" or "Apple Safari" as your browser. When you get to the live stream, right click, and options pop up which allow you to choose to have the picture fill the whole screen.
