Dear Parishioners.

This past week we began Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is one of the seasons of the Church year and is marked with the color green. It is the longest season of the Church year and comes in two parts. The first part is about eight weeks in length but differs from year to year based on when Easter falls. The second part is much longer and goes from the end of the Easter season to the beginning of Advent.

There are several distinct characteristics of Ordinary time besides green for a liturgical color. It is the time when we hear extensively from one of the Gospels. This year we will be hearing primarily from Luke's Gospel. It is also the season where we hear about the teachings of Jesus and the miracles he performs. The bulk of the Lord's life here on Earth is explored during Ordinary Time.

I encourage you to take special interest in the Gospel during Ordinary Time. Follow along with the readings from week to week and take some time to pray on them.
