

Dear Parishioners,

Monday August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgil Mary. Since it falls on a Monday this year the Church won't celebrate it in the way that we normally do. However, we should acknowledge the feast day.

The Solemnity of the Assumption is the celebration of the assumption of Mary, body and soul, into the Kingdom of Heaven and ends her life on earth. This is not in the Bible, but it is one of the major traditions the Church has celebrated through the centuries. It is also the Fourth Glorious Mystery of the Rosary. The tradition around this feast day developed early in the Church but it was defined dogmatically by Pope Pius XII in 1950.

I also want to let you know that we received \$16,508.67 from the Upon This Rock campaign last week. I thank everyone who has donated to this campaign over the years. It has been a blessing in helping us to address some of our needs as a parish.
